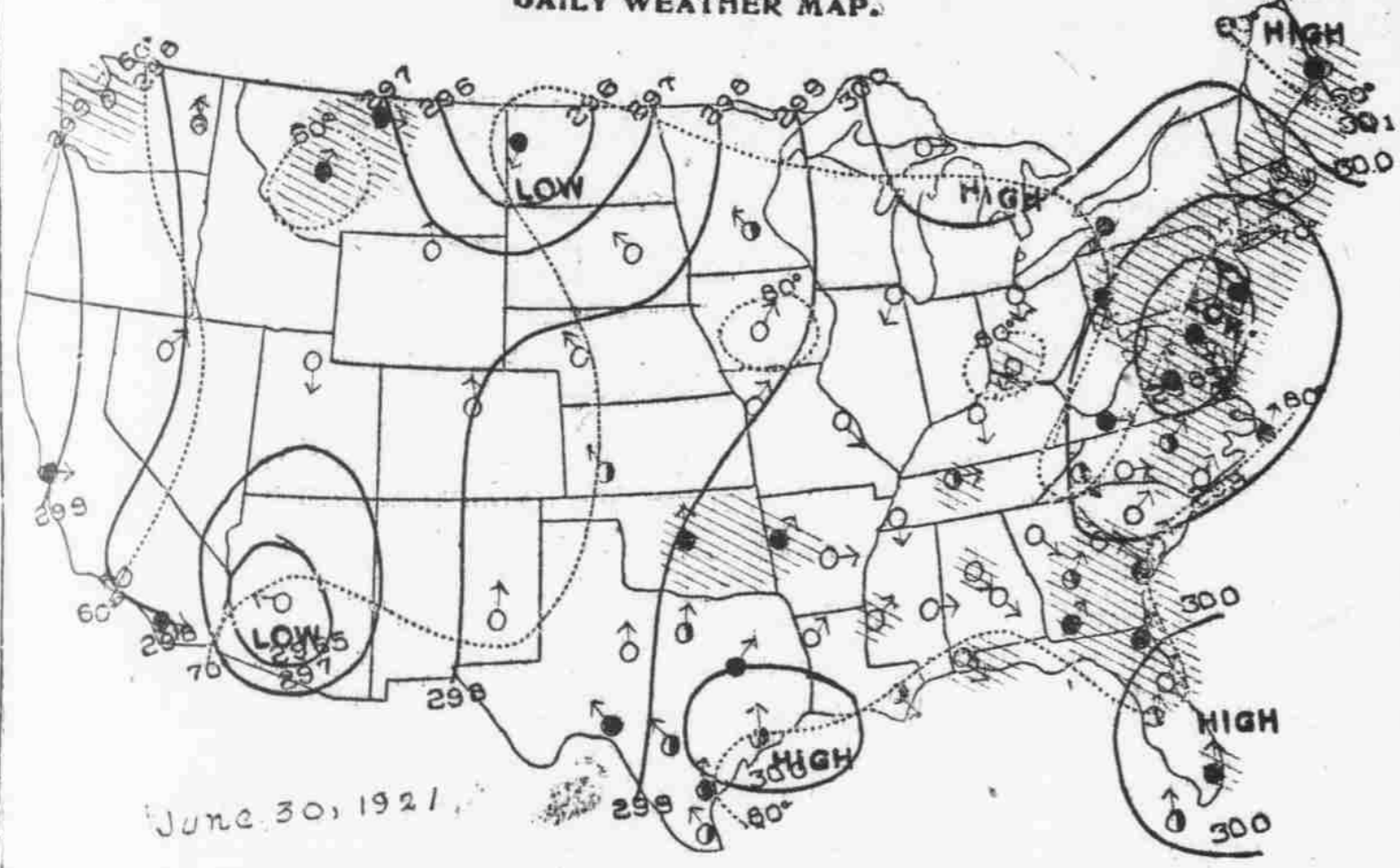

WEATHER CONDITIONS.
June 30, 1921.
Pressure distribution remains practically the same west of the Mississippi river and over the Gulf states. The depression yesterday over the lower Lakes has moved southwestward, followed by a "high" of moderate strength, extending from the upper Lakes to northern New England.
There have been light to moderate showers in the Atlantic coast states of the cotton belt, Mississippi valley, western Arkansas, Oklahoma and locally in Alabama, with heavy rains of 1.50 to 3.00 in, in northeastern Florida and 1.00 to 1.20 in, at a few stations elsewhere.
Light showers have also fallen in the middle Ohio valley, and mostly light to moderate rains in the middle and north Atlantic states, heavy rains being reported from the vicinity of Boston. In the middle-west, west and northwest fair weather continues, except for light to moderate showers in Montana and Washington.
Temperatures have been slightly above normal in most districts of the cotton belt, and continue from 5 to 10 degrees above the seasonal average in all northern districts except New England, with maxima ranging from 90 to 96 in the northwest and from 85 to 94 in the middle west.
Partly cloudy weather is indicated for this vicinity to night and Friday, with probably local thundershowers Friday. While no decided change in temperature will occur in the 24 hours, the pressure distribution in the northeast is favorable for at least a temporary break in the hot weather by Friday night or Saturday.

LOCAL BANKS PAY THEIR DIVIDENDS
Stockholders Get \$187,000 as Their Share for Half of 1921.

The banks of Charlotte have declared nearly \$200,000 in dividends in the last six months, according to a summary of the banks' semi-annual dividends, this in addition to substantial funds added to the surplus and profits accounts.

Increased percentage in dividends was made by some of the banks, indicating that, in spite of depressed business conditions, the banking institutions here have been able to maintain their usually normal and healthy condition and in some cases to grow steadily. It has been a prosperous period with most of the banks during the six months, as indicated by the fact that semi-annual dividends range all the way from 3 to 9 per cent. Cash dividends will be mailed out to the stockholders of most of the banks July 1, the total of this to amount to about \$187,000.

The Bank of North Charlotte, shut one year old, and the Fifth Street Industrial Bank, also about a year old, are the only two banks which did not declare a half-year dividend, but have added earnings to surplus and undivided profits accounts. Both banks have, however, done good business, their officials declare, during the period they have been in business.

The Security Savings Bank about two years old, with a capital stock of \$100,000, declared 3 per cent dividend, about \$3,000 going to stockholders.

The American Trust company is declaring a 4 per cent semi-annual dividend on its capital stock of \$1,200,000, about \$48,000 going to stockholders.

Independence Trust company is declaring 4 per cent semi-annual dividend on its capital stock of \$1,600,000. Substantial additions were made to the undivided profits.

The First National Bank is declaring 6 per cent, making \$18,000 going out to the stockholders. Additions are made to the undivided profits account.

The Union National Bank is declaring a 6 per cent dividend on \$200,000 capitalization, with \$12,000 sent out in checks to stockholders.

Nine per cent dividend is being declared by the Merchants & Farmers Bank on \$200,000.
