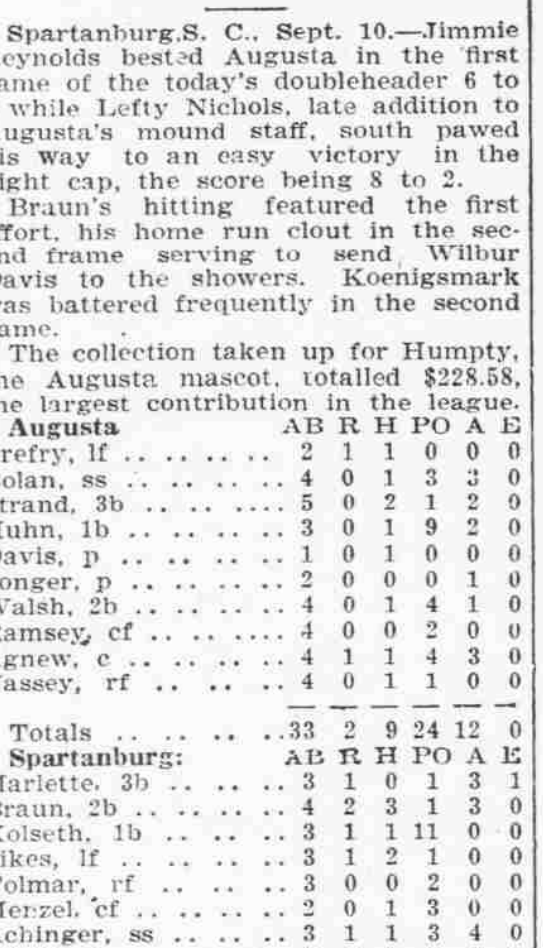
### Polarines Master Hoskins in Championship Series With Ease.

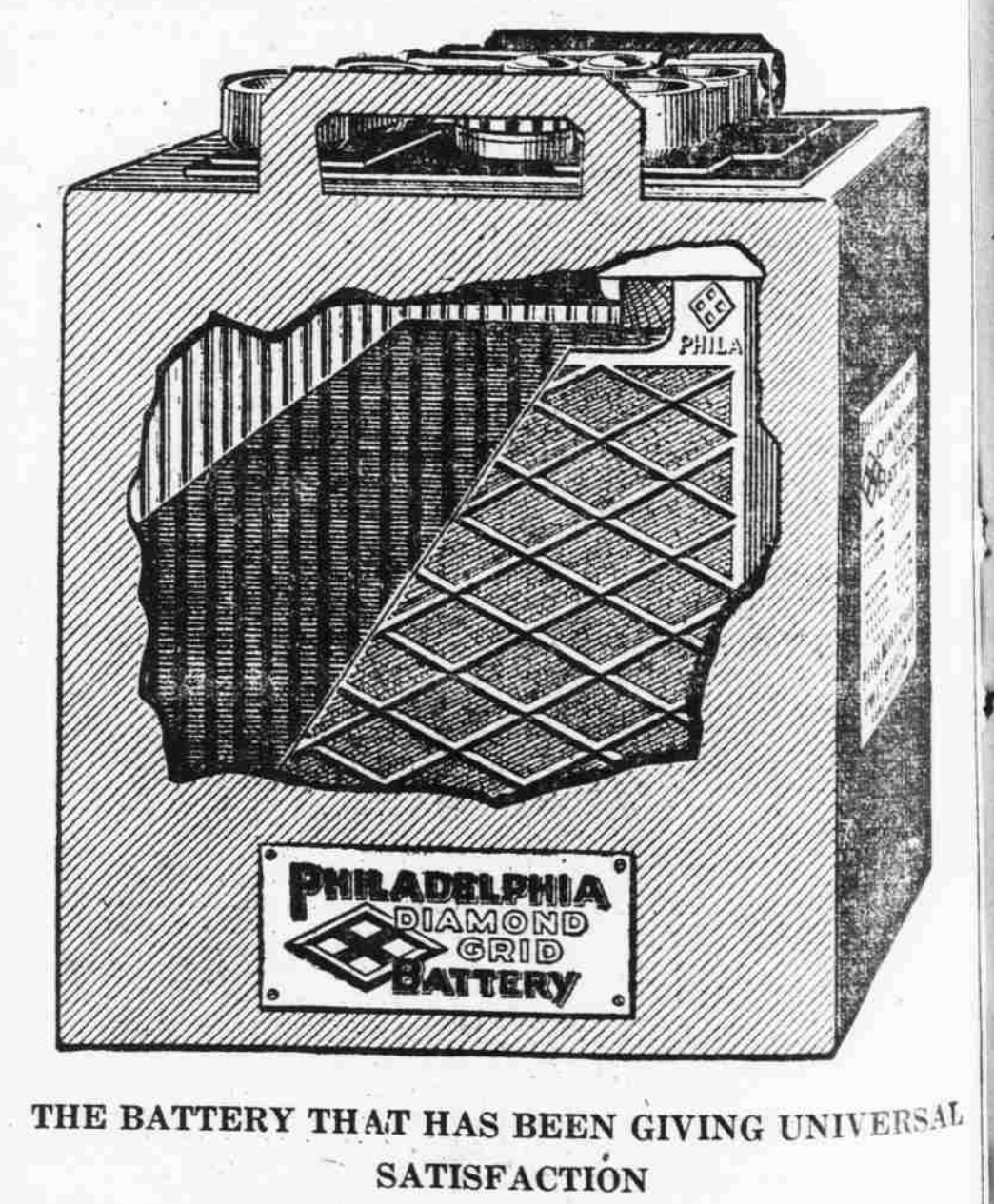
