

Baseball Magnates Are Expected to Close 1921 Sessions Today.

Buffalo, N. Y., Dec. S .- The dele

gates at the annual meeting of the National Association of Professional Saseball Leagues went into what may be the closing session today, with the admonitions of Commissioner K. M. Landis still ringing in their ears. Baseball he told them at the annual dinner last night, must be better in its morality than any other business, because it serves a great, overwhelming, influencing public opinion and because "the ideals of fandom are the highest ideals." warned against any undue optimism "ever the return from the slough into which we were precipitated in the Fall of 1920," adding that "baseball is still on trial in America and will continue on trial as long as baseball is pluyed.
