Deserter of Car Said to be Man Arrested on Bench Warrant in Winston.

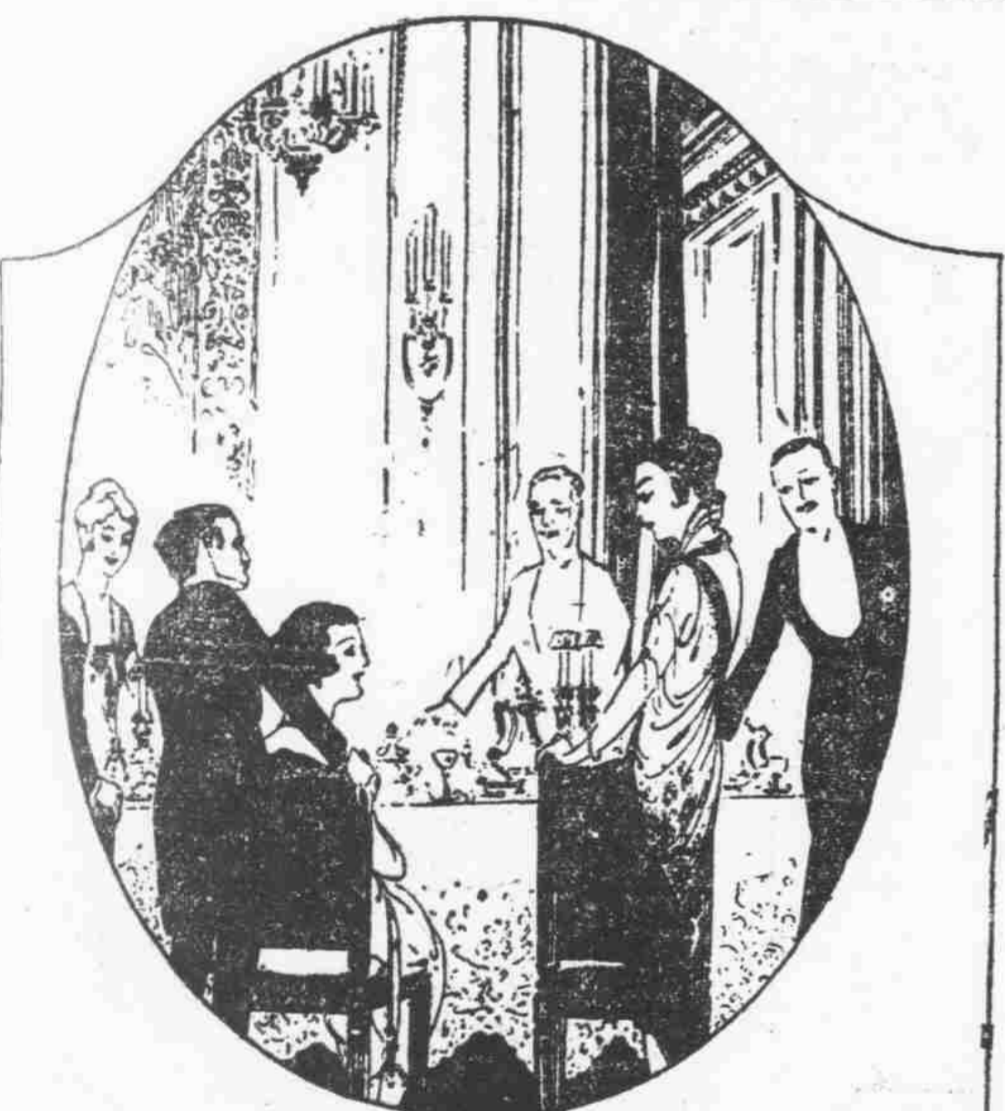

ASHEVILLE OFFICIALS CLASH OVER SCHOOLS

Asheville, Dec. 14.—Plans and specifications for the proposed school for colored children on Catholic Hill were brought under official fire at the hands of R. L. Fitzpatrick and R. J. Sherrill, city commissioners, Tuesday, and a city councilman refused to attend the proceedings.

Charges were made by Commissioner Sherrill that plans for the Catholic Hill school, as prepared by Ronald Greene, would not work. He said that the building could not stand if constructed according to those plans.

Heated discussion developed among the commissioners, during which Commissioner Sherrill repeatedly charged that competent mechanics and builders have pronounced the Catholic Hill school plans defective. Commissioner Sherrill also raised a question as to the competence of J. S. Zimmerman as an architect.

(Continued from Page One.) ed to the Constitutional Convention in 1923. The Governor, according to reports, believes the constitutional convention would cause a good deal of sin and commotion, and he does not want law during the time when all activities of the State are engaged in the big building program. The Governor has called in some members of the Senate for a conference with them.

The school deficit bill, authorizing the Treasurer to sell \$110,000 worth of bonds to meet the deficit in the State public school fund for last year, went through the Senate in the affirmative, not being riddled even when the reading clerk called the bill. There were Republicans and Democrats all over the bill, but the measure passed along with the host of other second reading roll call measures.

The school deficit bill, authorizing the Treasurer to sell \$110,000 worth of bonds to meet the deficit in the State public school fund for last year, went through the Senate in the affirmative, not being riddled even when the reading clerk called the bill.

LONG BILL GOES BACK

The sentiment in the Senate which on Monday night brought out the bill calling on the Commissioner of Revenue and Board of Equalization to give publicity to all appeals for tax rebates, exemptions and refunds, as well as the causes for neglecting such appeals, and put the measure through second reading without committee reference, was balked on Tuesday morning, when Senator Fisher Long's bill carrying these provisions, was referred to the judicial committee for consideration.

A joint resolution introduced in the House Tuesday by Representative Fisher Long calls upon the Interstate Commerce Commission to "begin a schedule of freight and passenger rates applicable to the railway's point of reduction not less than 15 percent of the amounts now charged."

At the committee hearing just prior to the opening of the House at 11 o'clock Mrs. Joseph Daniels, Dr. Jernan spoke in opposition to the bill. The measure was defended by Representative Neal. The delegation of women urged defeat of the bill, saying that the primary had its faults but that was much better than the old convention system of nominating candidates.

President R. W. H. Stone, of the North Carolina Farmers Union, also came before the committee in opposition to the bill on behalf of the farmers of the State.

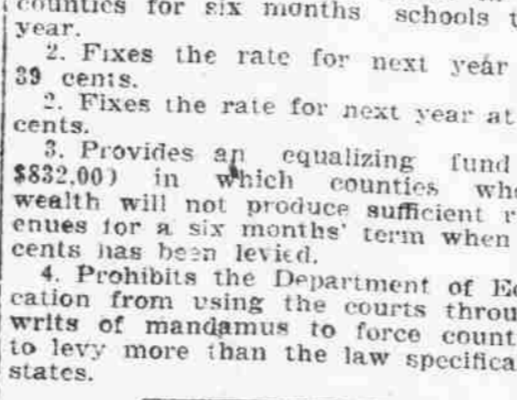


BABY BURNED TO DEATH IN CRADLE

FEWER SPINDLES ACTIVE IN SOUTH

More Cotton Consumed in November Than in Same Month a Year Ago.

Washington, Dec. 14.—Cotton consumed during November amounted to 226,910 bales of lint and 53,257 bales of linters compared with 222,712 of lint and 54,287 of linters in November last year, the Census Bureau announced today.

Cotton on hand November 30 in consuming establishments amounted to 1,648,216 bales of lint and 152,340 of linters, compared with 1,118,418 of lint and 225,613 of linters a year ago, and in public storage 222,613 of lint and 176,689 of linters, compared with 5,100,987 of lint and 340,137 of linters a year ago.

Imports during November amounted to 31,450 bales, compared with 22,512 in November last year.

Exports in November were 648,695 bales, including 18,555 bales of linters, compared with 683,323 bales, including 2,501 bales of linters in November last year.

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF SEWERAGE BONDS AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE PAYMENT AND INTEREST THEREON.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Charlotte deemed it necessary to extend and enlarge the present sewerage system of the City; NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Charlotte, North Carolina:

Section 1. That the City of Charlotte, pursuant to the law of North Carolina and the Municipal Finance Act of 1919, issue its bonds for the purpose of extending and enlarging the sewerage system, all within and for the City of Charlotte, North Carolina.

Section 2. That the maximum aggregate of said bonds shall be One Hundred and Fifty Thousand (\$150,000) Dollars.

Section 3. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 4. That a statement of the debt of the said City has been filed with the Clerk thereof pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act and is open to public inspection.

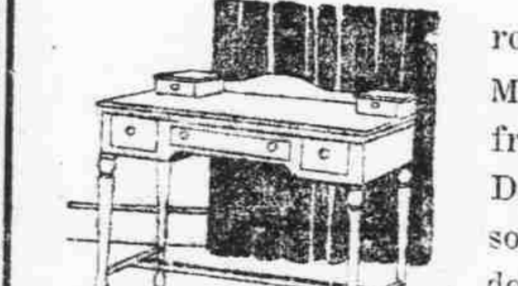
