BLAKE NOT ALLOWED TO HAVE DAUGHTER
 H. M. Blake, well known taxicab business man of Charlotte, has been denied the possession of eight-year-old Natalia Blake, his daughter, in habeas corpus proceedings heard in Raleigh. The child will remain with its mother, Mrs. M. D. Muse, of Raleigh, a former wife of the Charlotte man.

Judge Bond heard the proceedings and announced at the outset that he would consider only evidence dealing with the qualifications of Mrs. Muse to possess the little girl. He said that, by reason of the fact that Mr. Blake had been divorced from his former wife for adultery and because of other indict-

ments pending against him, he would not consider his own fitness to take charge of the child. The evidence then pivoted upon the fitness of Blake's former wife to keep the daughter.

Blake was represented by D. E. Henderson, of the Charlotte bar, in addition to Raleigh lawyers.

The case grew out of an alleged abduction of the child by Blake during Fair Week, when he went down to Raleigh and took his little daughter to the fair, later coming directly to Charlotte with her. Mrs. Muse immediately had a warrant served on him and instituted habeas corpus proceedings to regain possession of the child.

The case against Blake for abduction is still pending in the courts of Wake county.

TWO FRENCH SAILING VESSELS ARE CAUGHT
