The completed figures in the office of County Auditor Floyd M. Gresham, on which work has been progressing for many weeks reveal that the total assessed valuation of all property in the county is \$122,164 486. In 1920 the total assessed valuation was \$\$140,697,632. The compilation includes real, personal. corporation evcess railroad and all other forms of property liable for tax.
