



MESSAGE GOES TO RIGHT PLACE

Without Name Goes Direct to Former President Wilson; Sends Greetings.

St. Louis, Dec. 29.—A telegram without any personal designation, merely addressed to "The man unto whom humanity is most indebted for a code of practical, unselfish world-wide rules of action which will ultimately lead to peace on earth and good will among nations thereof, Washington, D. C." was received by former President Woodrow Wilson at his home here today.

The telegram was sent Christmas Eve by Edward P. Goltra, Democratic National Committeeman from Missouri.

Mr. Wilson and I warmly appreciate the message you were kind enough to send and I take the liberty of sending through you to the Democratic message my most cordial greetings and my confident prediction of triumphant success of the party in the new year and the years immediately to follow.

Mr. Goltra's message was:

"The Democrats of this State send greetings and very earnest wishes for a happy Christmas for you and your faithful helpmate."

GERMAN CITIES TRY TO AVOID CARNIVALS

Berlin, Dec. 29.—The German government has been asked to forbid the annual pre-Christmas carnivals which for four days are held in virtually every South German and Rhineland city.

Complaint is made that the carnival season is "too frivolous and impoverishing to the population which cannot refrain from participating."

During these carnivals the whole population of country and city parade the streets with confetti, blow noisemakers and feast. It is necessary to purchase tickets for the restaurants in the city, and all stores are closed for the four days.

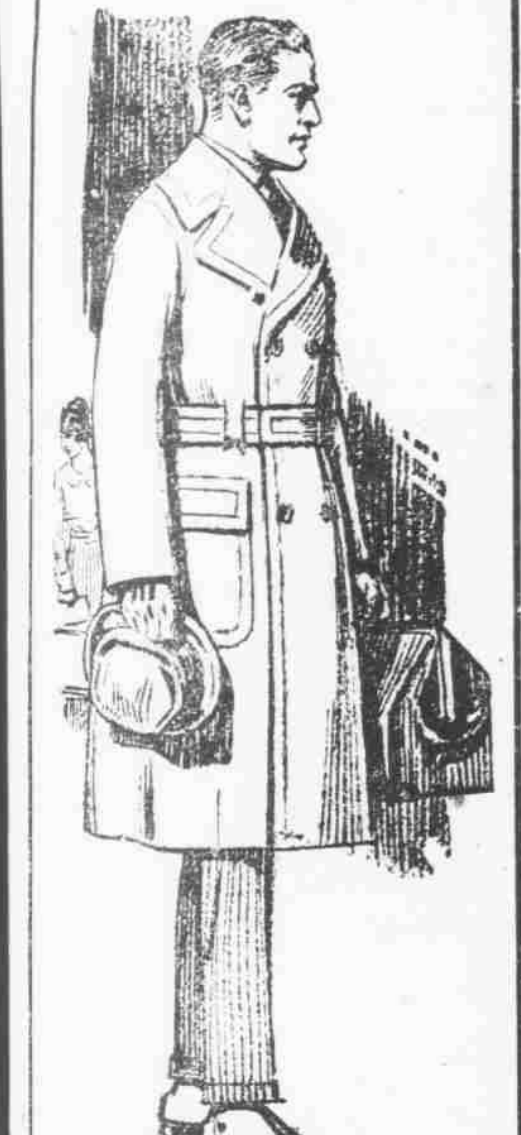
"It is impossible to keep aloof from the excitement of these carnivals," said a representative of Cologne, where the merry-making carnivals once was held. "The people dress up fantastically and delightfully with utter disregard for expenses. A gloomy countenance is the one for a bombardment of confetti, of ribbon and paper, until its owner laughs and joins the frolicers."

The complainants declare this is no time for frivolity in Germany and that it would waste money which will be sorely needed.

A number of municipalities forbade the carnivals on their own accounts last year, but preparations for scores of celebrations this year prompted the appeal direct to the central government.
