A. R. P. CHURCHES TO UNITE IN SERVICES

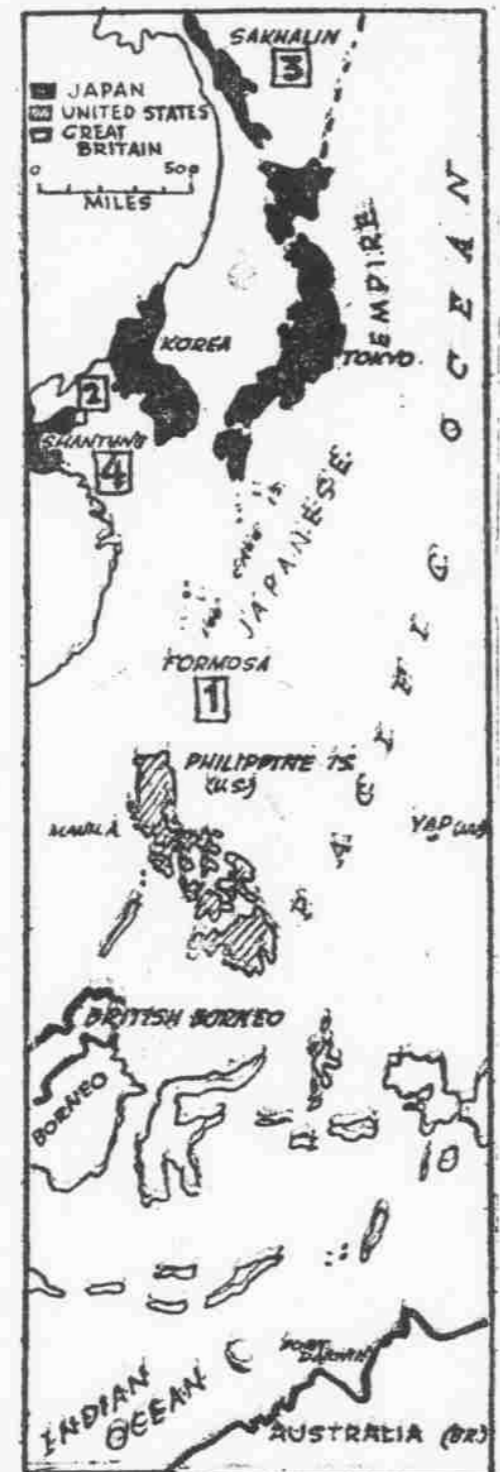

HERE'S HOW JAP NATION EXPANDED



Map shows the Japanese empire and acquisitions since 1895. Figures indicate main portions acquired.

Japan's expansion, which has been brought before the world by the arms conference developments, began after the Chinese-Japanese war in 1895. The Japs then acquired Formosa and the Pescadore islands, indicated by figure 1. Since then they have acquired Port Arthur and the Liautung peninsula (2), the lower and northern halves of Sakhalin (3), and concessions in Shantung (4).

Debs, Socialist leader, paroled several days ago from Federal prison, was resting at his home here today following a rousing homecoming celebration tendered him last night by thousands of his followers and fellow townsmen. Persons in the big crowd which formed about the Debs' home were bedecked with red hats, carrying brands of red fire and large placards in flaming red colors.
