THE NORTH WILL RECOIL

Says Henry Watterson Anent the Partisan Acts of Congress.

CHARLESTON, S. C., April 29.— The Southern editors are getting here in numbers. The first arrival was Henry Watterson, who is to lec-ture tomorrow night on "Money and Morals." In an interview today Mr Watterson talked politics to some extent. He said:

"I think the Republicans have bitten off more than they can chew. Their plan is to secure, during the two years in which they possess the Government, all legislation that they will need for ten years.
