A CALL BY GOV. HOLT.

THE NEWS has received the following, signed by Thos. M. Holt, Governor:

In accordance with the expressed desire of the Southern Inter-State Immigration Convention held in the city of Asheville, N. C., in December last and in compliance with the will of a large number of leading citizens from each section of the State, I hereby call a convention of all those interested in the upbuilding of North Carolina to assemble in the city of Raleigh on the 13th day of May, at 5 p. m., in the Commons Hall of the State.

POPULATION OF CITIES.

The Census Office has issued a bulletin giving the population of cities in the country containing 8,000 inhabitants or more.

The increase has been quite regular from the beginning up to 1880, while from 1880 to 1890 it has made a leap from 22.57 up to 29.12 per cent.

In 1880 there was but one city, New York, which had a population in excess of a million.

In 1870 there were but fourteen cities each containing more than 100,000 inhabitants.

The North Atlantic division contains nearly one-half the urban population of the country.

In the North Atlantic division 51.58 per cent, or more than one-half the entire population, is contained in cities of 8,000 or more inhabitants.

In the North Central division 25.90 per cent, or a trifle more than one-fourth of the inhabitants, are classed as urban.

In the South Atlantic and South Central divisions the proportion of urban population is comparatively small, being in the first named but 16.91 per cent of the entire population.

The urban element in the Western division in 1890 constituted 29.74 per cent of the whole population, while in 1880 it constituted 23.95 per cent.
