The strained relations existing between the United States and Chili may be the means of repealing a law in the statute books that has been sought to be repealed in several past Congresses.

Gov. Jackson undoubtedly has a high claim on the party leaders. They are under obligations to him for services rendered, but a great many seem to be the opposite to his being made Senator.

Smith has very little show just now, though endorsed by the Business Men's Association.

The election of police commissioner and State treasurer has been practically settled. President Schryver will succeed himself and Spencer Jones, of Montgomery, will be State treasurer.

Western Maryland also is keeping discreet silence. The impression is that a choice will be reached on Thursday and that Gibson will be the man.

An opinion of importance in its construction of the immigration laws was rendered in the United States Supreme Court yesterday in the case of Nishimura Ekin, appellant, against the United States.

This contention of the government the Supreme Court today sustains. It holds that the court can only decide whether or not immigration officers were duly appointed and acted in conformity with the directions of the act.

Senator Quay's Libel Suit. PITTSBURGH, Pa., Jan. 18.—A special to the Chronicle telegraphed from Beaver, Pa., says: The Quay-Star criminal suit was begun this morning. Great interest is felt in its progress.

It was nearly 11 o'clock when the case was called and the work of securing a jury was begun. It was at this point that Senator Quay first made his appearance and took his place with his counsel.

When an attempt was made by the commonwealth to stand aside John W. Smith, a democrat, Mr. Daugherty arose and protested in a violent manner, alleging that it was the purpose of the prosecution to select a partisan jury.

Judge Wickman replied that the court could not assume that any democratic juror would violate his oath. The word of selecting the jury is still in progress.

Senator Sherman said in an interview that he would retire from politics after the expiration of the term in the Senate to which he has just been elected.

Washington Post: A third party ticket is to be taken when the gentle springtime comes. Its wise and prudent parents have already prepared the clothes wherewith the expected youngster is to be adorned.

It will be remembered that a conference of delegates from all the labor organizations, the trade unions, the Farmers' Alliance, and kindred institutions was to have been held in this city on the 22nd of next month.

The meeting place has, however, been changed to St. Louis, because the political atmosphere of Washington is thought to be too thick with evil and suspicious things for the promoters of the new party to breathe it with impunity.

Believing that this conference will without a doubt, direct the holding of a convention for the nomination of a presidential ticket, the third party leaders here have gone so far as to frame a platform to be adopted at the nominating convention.

As to the wording and the plank there has been no final agreement, except that a pronounced opposition to the holding of large areas of land by individual aliens or foreign syndicates is to be incorporated.

The financial plank will declare against the national bank, not as a system, for it is realized that banks are necessary as money, but as a means of issuing money to the people.

The tariff plank will be a radical departure. Hitherto the Democratic position, which proposes the levying of duties only to the extent of providing for the expenses of the Government economically administered, has been satisfactory to the element which composes this new party.

Having thus framed the platform, it is natural that the leaders should have discussed the personnel of the ticket. It is generally conceded that the Vice-Presidency will go to L. L. Polk, the president of the National Farmers' Alliance.

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Altogether, this new third party ticket will give the politicians a little diversion, especially as it is claimed that it will receive no less than three million votes.
