MR. OATES' BANKING BILL

Representative Oates, of Alabama, addressed the House Committee on Banking and Currency last Friday, in support of his bill to authorize national banking associations to loan money on real estate security...

The second bill practically seeks to ruin the old State banks, with the exception that safeguards are thrown around them. The circulation is restricted and secured by State bonds equal to 75 per cent. of the amount of money to be issued...

The alleged attempt of Mr. Mills to organize a revolt against the policy to be adopted by the Ways and Means Committee in reporting bills to place specific articles on the list does not attract much attention at the Capitol...

A similar move will probably be made in Massachusetts, the purpose being, according to the popular theory, to impress the rest of the country before the several state conventions are held with an idea of the strength Mr. Cleveland will have in the national convention independent of New York...

Capt. Walton Appleton and Thomas H. Cummings, of Boston, are in Washington to confer with the departments relative to the construction of a monument in Santo Domingo to commemorate the rise of Christian civilization in the new world.

At the Presidential election of 100 years ago 135 votes were cast. Virginia led in the number of electors, having 21, and Massachusetts followed with 16, while Pennsylvania had 12, New York and North Carolina had 12 each, and Maryland 10.

The most positive indication of a war with Chile that has developed in Philadelphia is the fact that the International Navigation Company's steamship Ohio will be held at that port to be used as a transport for troops...

At the national Democratic convention to be held in Chicago on June 21, each State is entitled to a representation therein equal to double the number of the representation to which it is entitled in the next electoral college...

It is learned on good authority that the Government is endeavoring to arrange for an international silver convention, and that negotiations to that end are now in progress with Great Britain and France.
