Washington Post. When the first cable line was completed the message "Peace, wealth and good will toward man" was the first to be flashed from Europe to America.

Since the first intimation of trouble between this country and Chili there has been a continued telegraphic intercourse between the two.

For each word that is transmitted by cable to Chili this Government pays \$1.70. Ten thousand words at \$1.70 per word produce the sum of \$17,000.

It is interesting to note the course these cables take in transmission, and the route which they pass.

When the message is delivered to the Western Union Telegraph Company here it is transmitted to the Central Cable Office in New York city.

From New York it goes to Valparaiso, Chile, by way of Europe and Brazil, and also by the West Indies, but the most direct route is always preferred.

From Valparaiso it goes to Santiago. It requires several hours to transmit a message to Valparaiso, which is about 3,000 miles directly south of Washington.

All messages are now transmitted in the naval cipher, which is recognized as being one of the most intricate in use by any government.

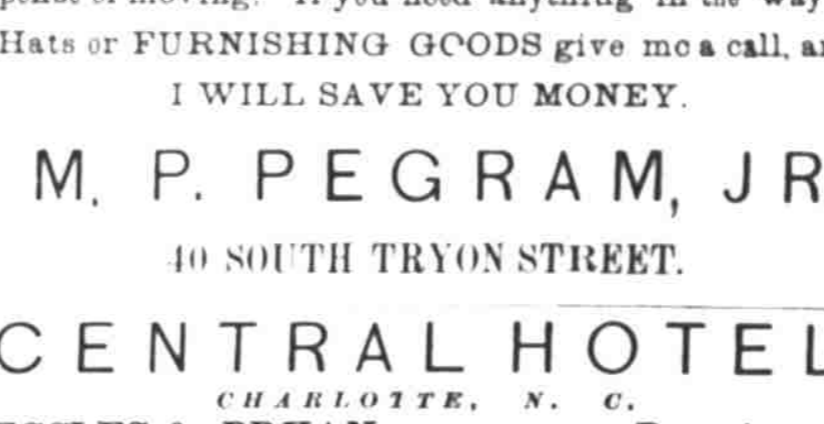
