The St. Louis Globe-Democrat doesn't believe that the Republicans have much to expect of the Democratic legislature of Missouri. If they are given one district out of the fifteen it will only be because the Democrats fear to leave three or four districts with small Democratic majorities, and in this event will conclude to form one solid Republican district. Outside of this consideration the only important event will be a scramble among the rural Congressmen to keep their districts from being changed. The Democratic state central committee will endeavor to boss the entire job. "I am in favor of making every district in Missouri Democratic," says ex-Attorney General Boone. "I am not in favor of any gerrymander to put any man in Congress, but knowing we have fourteen Democrats in Congress representing Missouri, there is no reason why we should not have fifteen, so long as we have been given by our growth in population an additional district." Mr. Boone doesn't believe in setting off a district specially for the accommodation of his Republican brethren.

The long-expected speech by Senator Palmer upon his proposed constitutional amendment providing for the election of Senators by the people was delivered Thursday. The Post says: Taking his position in the center aisle, in the place usually occupied by Mr. Ransom, of North Carolina, Senator Palmer, in clear resonant tones, addressed the Senate on the subject, members on both sides of the chamber giving earnest attention to him. At the close of his remarks, which occupied about three-fourths of an hour, Mr. Palmer received congratulations from his associates. He added in an informal way that he had sought to avoid all partisan allusions or any expression that should justify the belief that there was any interest involved in this proposition other than that of the several States alone.

Ex-Congressman Perry Belmont, of New York, declares for Hill as available and expedient. The Senator, he says, "appeals powerfully to the average Democrat as a leader who leads to success; but it was the Republicans and Mugwumps who actually made Hill a Presidential candidate." As to the machine in politics, Mr. Belmont says: "There always has been and always will be one in representative governments where universal suffrage and the caucus prevail. In New York there have been Clinton's, the Albany Regency, Van Buren's, Marcy's, Crosswell's, Seymour's, Dean Richmond's, Tilden's, and Manning's. The Whigs and Republicans of New York have had Thurlow Weed's, Conkling's, and now Platt's. A party must have a leader who leads or expect always to encounter defeat."

A rather novel argument was made to the House Committee on Agriculture against the anti-option bill. Mr. V. C. Brown, a miller of Fostoria, Ohio, after saying that dealing in futures was necessary to the protection of both millers and farmers, contended that in order to make the bill legal it should not discriminate; therefore it would be illegal for the pastor of a church to contract to deliver two sermons a Sunday for a specified future time, none of the sermons being written at the time the contract was made. The house-builder, too, he said, who contracted to building a house at a time when he did not own a stick of lumber, would also come under the provisions of the bill.
