The St. Louis Democrat doesn't believe that the Republicans have much to expect of the Democratic legislature of Missouri.

The long-expected speech by Senator Palmer upon his proposed constitutional amendment providing for the election of Senators by the people was delivered Thursday.

Ex-Congressman Perry Belmont, of New York, declares for Hill as available and expedient. The Senator, he says, "appeals powerfully to the average Democrat as a leader who leads to success."

A rather novel argument was made to the House Committee on Agriculture against the anti-option bill. Mr. V. C.
