Large Quantity Dynamite.

PARIS, Feb. 21.—Some excitement
has been caused in the past few days
in police circles by the receipt of
information that a large quantity of
dynamite had been stolen from the
factory belonging to the state where
that explosive was made. With
many safeguards as to its manufac-
ture and as to its subsequent storage
and disposition, it was immediately
concluded that the theft was the
work of anarchists, and today the
police searched all the houses in
Paris in the vicinity known to be
occupied by the anarchist, in ex-
pectation of finding dynamite. The
police refuse to divulge the result of
their search, and it is not known
whether or not they found expli-
sives.

Arranging for the Chicago Convention.

CHICAGO, Ill., Feb. 21.—The sub-
committee of the Democratic Na-
tional Committee, consisting of Can-
da, of New York, and Doran, of
Minnesota, Secretary Shearin, and
Sergeant-at-Arms Bright, met yes-
terday with Hopkins, Palmer and
Winston, representing the local com-
mittee. The meeting was a secret
one, but it is known that a satisfac-
tory agreement was reached regard-
ing the matter of tickets of admis-
sion to the convention hall. The
national committee and the sub-
committee will meet with the full
local committee today, when further
details will be discussed.

A Bill Resolved Defeated.

HUNTINGTON, W. Va., Feb. 21.—A
meeting of the Democrats of the
Fourth Congressional district, was
held here today. Several hundred
persons being present, the object
being the organization of leagues of
clubs in the district. Congressman
Cahart, Governor Fleming and
other prominent Democrats from all
parts of the State were present and
made speeches. The league was orga-
nized and the hardest campaign
the State has ever known was begun.
During the meeting a resolution declar-
ing allegiance to Senator Hill
was almost unanimously defeated;
while Cleveland's name was greeted
with rousing cheers.

Miss Willard's Hand.

CONVENTION HALL, St. Louis,
Feb. 23.—At an informal confer-
ence of prominent prohibitionists
this morning at the Southern Hotel,
Chairman Dickie and Miss Willard
united in a resolution to the effect
that as a party prohibition could
treat only with political forces that
declare for the same principles. This,
Miss Willard explained, does not in
the least interfere with the efforts
being so earnestly put forth by her-
self and other prohibitionists as
individuals to secure such declarations
from industrial conference as may
serve as a basis of future united poli-
tical action among the labor reform-
ers and temperance reformers. The
conference by Miss Willard said,
was entirely harmonious, and the
resolution was adopted with practi-
cal unanimity.

Two Children Burned to Death.

PITTSBURG, Pa., Feb. 21.—Two
children were burned to death in a
fire at McKeepsport last night, almost
within reach of their father, who in
his brave efforts to rescue his little
ones almost perished amid smoke
and flames, and it is not altogether
certain now that he will live. The
third child also is probably fatally
burned.
