CHARLOTTE: \$50,000.

THAT WILL BE THE NEW RAILROAD.

It Will Tap the Carolina Central at either Charlotte, Matthews, Monroe or Wadesboro. Propositions to the Several Towns.

That new railroad Concord has been talking about is to be built. Construction work will be well under way before the summer is ended. The road will run from Concord to some point on the Carolina Central road, either Charlotte, Matthews, Monroe or Wadesboro. This much is a settled fact.

The proposed road is incorporated under the name of the Concord Southern. The board of directors, whose names have been given previously in this News, met in Concord last night, to get the preliminary work started. The first thing done was to unanimously resolve that the road should be built, and that with out delay. The board then formulated propositions for the consideration of the four towns named. The subscription asked of Charlotte is \$50,000; of Matthews \$25,000; of Monroe \$10,000; and of Wadesboro \$10,000.

The treasurer of the company was authorized to purchase all the necessary land and stationery for office purposes. An assessment was made, to be collected at once, upon the stockholders for such an amount of cash as may be found necessary for immediate needs. Propositions for carrying the road have been presented to the person and by letter, to different parties, and the contract will be awarded shortly. The sentiment in Concord seems to be in favor of Matthews, thence to Lancaster, but each of the four towns will be given a fair chance.

Incidents of the Lake Walk.

The Queen City Guards benefit lake walk at the auditorium last night was attended by a large crowd and was a novel and unique entertainment. The cake, an immense three-story affair, weighing 65 pounds, was placed on a table in the center of the room. It was baked by Rigler & Lord and was a notably fine one. The walk did not begin until 7 o'clock, and then the procession moved in stately style by Capt. and Mrs. Wilkes began the promenade around the room to the music of the Naval Battalion band. After a number of circuits were made the music ceased and a single solo song by Mr. J. M. Thompson, Mr. J. W. Zimmerman and Miss Ida McDonald, who found to be on the winning mark and took the cake. A very excellent drill was given by the Harmon's Nest, Kellum, under the command of Capt. T. R. Robertson. The Harmon's appeared in fatigue uniform, with buff leggings, and drilled exceedingly well. Capt. Robertson was elected on popular ballot as the most popular military officer, and M. E. Peyton, Jr., as the most popular merchant. It was altogether a tip-top entertainment, and showed that genius is not lacking in Charlotte.
