## BALTIMORE COMPROMISE.

Several years ago, a workman  
named W. L. Lowe, from Newton,  
was finishing furniture on the sec-  
ond floor of Elliott & Marsh's factory,  
in this city. Directly beneath him  
on the first floor a piece of machin-  
ery was in operation. The revolving  
planer head suddenly burst and a  
fragment of it flew directly upward,  
crashed through the floor and struck  
Lowe on the leg, cutting and shat-  
tering it in such a manner as to re-  
quire amputation. Lowe brought  
suit against Elliott & Marsh. The  
jury gave Lowe a verdict for \$2,000.  
Elliott & Marsh took an appeal and a  
new trial was granted. The Newton  
Enterprise received today says that  
the matter has been finally com-  
promised, Mr. Lowe receiving \$1,800  
and paying the costs.

## A Fine Sample of Wheat.

This News has been telling what  
a fine prospect there is in Mecklen-  
burg for a great harvest of wheat  
and oats, and a specimen of the crop  
that is growing up in the northern  
corner of Mecklenburg was sent us  
today. It is a sample of wheat from  
the farm of Mr. Ben Wallace, at  
Fairfield. The wheat is five feet  
high and Mr. Wallace has 200 acres  
full up to the sample. Mr. Wallace  
sowed 40 bushels in wheat and oats  
and he will harvest the finest crop  
since that section in many years.

Little Edward Carson, the 20

of Mr. Jas. Carson, South Tryon  
street, at 10 o'clock.
