Notice! ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE CONSTRUCTION AND USE OF PRIVIES IN THE CITY. The Board of Aldermen of the City of Charlotte do enact: That section of 101, page 76, of the ordinances of the city be repealed and the following inserted in lieu thereof.

ORDINANCE REQUIRING DRIVERS AND OTHERS TO GIVE RIGHT OF WAY TO THE FIRE DEPARTMENT. Be it ordained, that whenever the alarm of fire shall be given, it shall be the duty of drivers of hacks, drays and other vehicles to immediately drive to one side of the street and occupy said side of the street until the fire department shall have passed or had time to reach the fire.

ORDINANCE FORBIDDING THE RIDING OF HORSES OR BICYCLES IN FRONT OF FIRE DEPARTMENT, ETC. It shall be unlawful for any person on horseback or on bicycles to race in front of or within the fire department when going to or from a fire, and all persons violating this ordinance shall be fined not exceeding \$50 or imprisoned not exceeding 30 days.
