Seventh street, up Seventh to Tryon up East Trade to College and thence to and thence to the Square. From the Square to Church; down Church to Fourth, up Fourth to Tryon and out Tryon to the Park.
 The line of march was headed by the Steele Creek band. Next came the carriages with distinguished speakers and following these were the floats. There were a good many of these. One of the prettiest was the one of the Standard Ice and Fuel Company. Several large blocks of pure, crystal ice with fruits and vegetables imbedded in them were mounted on a wagon, gaily decorated.
 J. H. Weddington & Co., J. B. Ivey & Co., Belk Bros. and several other merchants had floats in the parade. Several wood dealers were also represented in the line of march.
 Just ahead of the floats, the different unions of the city with members afoot carrying large streamers, designating their trade, made a good showing.
 After arriving at the park auditorium, the crowd surged in. The speakers were conducted to the rostrum.
 The exercises were opened with prayer by Rev. J. A. Dorrtee of Westminster church. After prayer a short address of welcome was delivered by Mayor P. M. Brown. At the conclusion of this Mr. J. T. A. Lawing, president of the Clerks Union, introduced Hon. Jerome Jones of Atlanta, the principal speaker of the day. Mr. Jones' address was replete with sound logic and healthy sentiment. The crowd listened attentively and seemed to be thoroughly entertained.
