Chicago, Jan. 9.—Wheat—It was stated that Liverpool houses were selling wheat here at and seaboard while replacing with Argentine purchases. There was a little selling early but offerings were well taken by commission houses, some of the buying thought to be for Balkan, while Armour was thought to have bought not less than 500,000 bushels. May receipts were light in the Northwest and there were indications that the export business would be large which started local shorts to cover. Towards close the market became quite firm under liberal export takings at seaboard. Outside business is still light and while local operator may be successful in working values higher, we would favor sales on hard spots.
