#### INVENTION BEATS BURGLARY.

#### For \$50,000.

Trenton, N. J., July 14.-Charles Filer, who was parolled from State for having invented a blind lock-stitch sewing machine while serving his profit by his invention. The English

rights to it have been sold for \$50,000. When he left the prison local capitalists agreed to market the invention, Richard Barlow, Charles W. Scudder and Samuel Gaston, well-known Trenton business men, agreeing to finance its manufacture.

Mr. Barlow has just closed the English deal, which gives, besides \$50,000 cash, \$25,000 in stock of the English concern. It is reported that another large offer has been made for the Russian rights. The machine has been patented in 34 countries.

The local capitalists, in addition to backing Filer when he came out of superinted the construction of the machines. He says each machine does the work of 20 men, and does it better than they could do it by hand.
