In answer to those who think this issue of bonds will increase the tax rate we say the tax rate will not be increased. The present levy of 25 cents on the \$100 will pay the interest on the bonds and leave a surplus of \$25,000 or \$30,000 with which to keep the roads in repair.

Some of the roads now need repairing and it is of vital importance that the extension of roads be completed as early as possible so more attention may be given to the repair work. The county now has all machinery to do this work, hence no expenditure for new machinery will be necessary.

With this bond issue the roads can in our opinion be finished in four or not more than five years.
