They had all spirited up apparently to make the last dash in the long race to the end, a spark of interest and excitement, as a reward for the patience shown by everybody during the long and often tedious proceedins. District Attorney Holton was prevented by the ruling of the court from getting in some of his usual final testimonal pyrotechnics, and so the case just died out evidencial fire.
