New York, Feb. 27.-The March notices dominated everything, or rather March notices and liquidation on the one hand, and covering on the other eansed an irregualr market. It is belived, however, that this bugbear has been pretty well eliminated, and the effect it is thought, will be to impart creater steadiness, if only temporarily, to the market. New York Sun's Summary Stocks. Orleans, La.)

New York, Feb. 27.—The greater ity goods can be bought. optimism in professional speculative sentiment that was evident in Wall Street during the latter part of last week was again strong in control of the movement of security prices and although the upward movement was conducted somewhat irregularly, exceptions to the general tendency being shown by several prominent stocks, and although the market was less animated than it recently has been, considerable net gains were commonly shown in the active stocks, at the close of the day. Abroad the course of values in the financial markets was directly the reverse of that witnessed here, for which the chief reasons seemed to be the continued forced liquidation of Kaffir mining stocks on the London stock exchange, and renewed anxiety over the Morroccan situation. It was said by close observers of the day's business that the market was to an unusual degree of professional character, and that the largest buyers of stocks were the western speculative party who were openly, at least, the argest sellers a week ago. However, this may be, it was plainly the buying of stocks rather than the selling that was effective upon quoted values.
