



New York, June 30 .- The July notices, amounting to 60,000 bales, had less effect than was expected. It is not the first time that the bears have mapped out a certain programme for a day, only to find that they had got the cart before the horse. At any tate, although prices declined modcrately, early in the day, they soon turned the other way, and advanced sharply under the influence of buying by the large spot houses, and others.

A good many thought this indicated a firm under-tone. At least, it indicated hat cotton is no such drug in the mar ket as the pessimists had supposed. The weather was favorable, the Liverpool abvices were not by any means inspiring and the speculations was small. But in spite of it all there was buying of a good character, and now way it would not be at all surprising to see a healthier market, at least for a time. The chort interest is still very large in the next crop, and some private Liverpool advices state that the under-tone there is firm. Some have "evened up" pending the Government report which is to appear on July 3rd.




