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

# Old-fashioned JUDGE S. B. ADAMS CHOSEN CHAIRMAN

Special The News. Greensboro, July 11.-After a very stormy session, the State Republican Convention last night, at nine o'clock elected Judge Spencer B. Adams as chairman of the State Executive Committee. He received on the first ballot 476 votes. Congressman Blackburn received 297 and Mr. Harris 84, giving Judge Adams a clear majority of 95.

This brings to an end a long drawn out contest, at least as far as the control of the organization is concerned of the Republicans in this State and from present indisations the party may get together and have but little more squabbling, until after the election at

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
