MANY SHOTS FIRED. Officers Chased Negro Down North Tryon Street Last Night.

An unknown thief played a strange game on North Tryon street this morning at 1:30 o'clock, and a part of the man's movements were witnessed by Mr. Charlie Roberts, at Wadsworth's livery stable.

The man came down North Tryon St. until he reached the jewelry store of Mr. W. E. Lineback, and stopping a moment he deliberately smashed the glass out of the front door entrance, and crossing the street he sat down to await developments.

Then, as a good many people were passing, the man went down the street a short distance, and returning, went stealthily to the door and climbed in. At this juncture Mr. Roberts, who saw the man enter, phoned the police, and Officers Farrington and Irvine went down.

The officers reached the scene as soon as possible and arrived just in time to get a fusillade of shots at the fleeing form of the negro, who ran up North Tryon street, being lost in the darkness at the corner of Tryon and Seventh.

The pistol shots fired, about six in all, only served to add speed to the negro's running, and when he was last spied by the officers through the shadows on the sidewalk, he was making record time. If he kept that pace up long he must have gotten well beyond the city limits before the officers returned from their race.

In the store nothing is missing as the man was inside only a short time, and then emerged at the front door and went away. There is no clue as to who the man was.
