MANY REPUBLICANS TAKING PLEDGES FOR CANNON

Mr. Wilson, of Washington, Again in Greensboro Looking After The Interest of Speaker Cannon—Will Fight Taft.

Says That Every Officer of Republican Club is Now in The Field for Cannon—Taft Leads in North Carolina.

Greensboro, N. C., Feb. 20.—The mysterious Mr. Wilson, of Washington, whose presence here a week ago as a representative of the allied anti-Taft forces was mentioned, is here again, or at least was, last night, when he was in close conference with Cannon republican boomers or sympathizers like Judge Bynum, O. D. Benbow, Col. Al. Fairbroth, B. S. Sharpe and others. There was another very important personality present, clerk of the United States court for the eastern district, H. L. Grant. It is impossible to relate exactly what were the plans formed at this conference, but since then there seems to be nobody here except Judge Douglas and his son, Postmaster Robert Douglas, who are outspoken thick and thin friends of Taft. It is safe to conclude that the conference was for the purpose of considering ways and means of taking care of other points in the state. Over ten days ago this correspondent quoted a republican as saying that the organization of "republican clubs" in the state was but a movement to get together elements in the party opposed to being pledged by Chairman Adams to the president's candidate and that future events would show it. "Mr. Wilson," this republican now points out, was here on the eve of the formation of the Greensboro Republican Club, was here that night, and he now declares "that every officer of the club is out in the open working for Cannon, with Greensboro as headquarters where it will work for Foraker, Fairbanks, or anybody else except Taft in sections of the state where 'Old Joe' has no friends."

While it would seem that the anti-Taft element has the other crowd on the run, one of this faction was making

a loud talk this morning of "dirty work," which he declared was going on to defeat the will of the people in the eighth district. He said that out of 10 members of the congressional committee of that district every one of them except Chairman Cowles, of Wilkes, and Deputy Collector Wagoner, of Iredell, were strong Cannon men. He said there was to have been a meeting of this committee at Taylorsville last Thursday, and it became known that a resolution declaring for Cannon had been prepared and would have been adopted at the meeting; that Chairman Cowles found this out and called the meeting off on the ground that there was too much ice and snow for members to get there, and set Tuesday as the date. Tuesday he says there was no quorum, but the meeting was declared to be "off," the only thing now to be done being the naming of a time and place for holding the district convention to name delegates, etc. This Cannon man said it was plainly a trick to prevent the committee from expressing its preference for Cannon, it being known that such an expression would have a tremendous effect in other sections of the state and whole country, and the "managers" were playing for time, hoping thereby to get a new grip on the Taft forces in the state and district.

Whether there is more plausibility than truth in this charge, is a problem to be solved correctly only by those knowing the situation. It is a serious charge and shows that the two factions are getting ready to get hot.

Big Real Estate Auction Sale Held at Maxton

Receiver Appointed for Barber Buggy Company
