New York, March 21.—John D. Rockefeller III, heir presumptive to one of the largest fortunes in the world, was two years old today. From all accounts he is a fine, healthy, blue-eyed youngster, who is just beginning to take a lively interest in what goes on about him.

The heir to the millions is being brought up in accordance with the traditions of the Rockefeller family. In other words, means that the follies and foibles of the sons of many millionaires of today will be tabooed. The youngster will find in his father a most excellent example of a millionaire who prefers the simple life to the pleasures of high society.

Mrs. John D. Rockefeller, Jr., who was Miss Abby Aldrich, daughter of Senator Aldrich of Rhode Island, shares her husband's tastes. Notwithstanding the wealth and social prominence to which she has been accustomed all her life, Mrs. Aldrich cares nothing for society and its frivolities. She is pretty and attractive and could easily shine should she care to enter the lists. But her interests are in opposite directions. She has advanced ideas about education and is a student of literature. She is interested in practical charity and much prefers to investigate and relieve a genuine case of distress than to spend an afternoon with a dressmaker talking about the fit of a gown.

Young Mrs. Rockefeller is not particularly fond of outdoor sports, although she shares her husband's love for horses. She golfs a little and can swim and sail a small boat. She much prefers to read a solid work on an educational topic than to dance or attend a dinner party.

Vigorous Fight Against American Tobacco Co.

Special to The News. Winston-Salem, N. C., March 21.—In accordance with plans adopted at Danville, Va., by the Bright Tobacco Growers Protective Association, of Virginia and North Carolina, the fight, which was begun several years ago against the American Tobacco Company, will be vigorously continued. A press dispatch says: Money was raised and committees appointed to wage a campaign for better organization among the farmers. The plan of the association is to pool the tobacco and to hold until prices fixed by the association can be secured, thus abolishing the present method of selling at auction on the warehouse floors.

Addresses were made by President H. O. Kerns, Interstate Organizer S. G. Adams, and others. The speakers touched on the needs of the "Night Riders" in Kentucky, which was described as deplorable, but brought about by conditions, which had become almost unbearable. They were opposed to violence here and urged permanent organization and co-operation as the means of arranging better prices. Three hundred delegates attended the meeting today.

Petition in Bankruptcy. Asheville, N. C., Mar. 21.—A voluntary petition in bankruptcy has been filed in the office of the clerk of the United States district court by W. H. Kimpton of Montreat and was sent to Judge Boyd for adjudication. In the petition, which was filed by Attorneys Wells & Swain and Chas. G. Lee, it is stated that the preferred debts amounted to \$237, the secured debts to \$935 and the unsecured debts to \$1,737, making total liabilities \$3,009. The assets are stated to be \$6 in household effects, \$2,500 stock in store and \$450 open accounts, a total of \$2,956.
