THE ROCK QUARRY PROBLEM Dangerous Hole at Foot of College Street Giving Trouble.

How to get rid of the old rock quarry at the foot of College street is a problem which the city administration has to battle with now, and was about the only matter given attention by the board of health last night.

This matter has been up for discussion several times, but so far it has been unsolvable.

The hole is on the land of the railroad, but was dug by the city several years ago, and now is a great cavern of filthy water, which is a menace to life and health.

At the meeting of the board of aldermen Monday night, Fire Chief W. S. Orr stated that a fence should be placed around the hole, as there was great danger of children falling in, thus causing the city to be liable for damages.

Only a few days ago the city lost one of its finest mules in this hole, and this accident brought it forcibly to mind that something must be done. It is estimated that it would take 250,000 yards of dirt to fill the hole and this would cost about \$50,000, a gigantic undertaking.

Just what will be done in regard to the matter is uncertain, as none of the members so far have been able to hit upon a feasible plan.

The board of health, at its meeting last night, discussed the matter, and a committee consisting of Dr. B. J. Witherspoon was appointed to confer with the aldermen, to see if some plan could not be devised to rid the city of this menace.

It was also decided that no more trash be thrown in the hole, as there were several complaints from residents in this neighborhood that the burning rubbish was very bad.
