Crozier before the house committee on banking and currency, that a prominent financier had told President Mellen that the panic was to be brought on before the meeting of congress and that on that information Crozier said the railroad borrowed thirty millions of dollars.

This statement Mr. Mellen today in the strongest language denounced as absurd and unqualifiedly false.






