

Details of The News' Great Popularity Contest

Division of District

The city of Charlotte and vicinity has been divided into five districts for the purpose of this contest. These districts are as follows:

District No. 1.—All that part of the city of Charlotte lying west of the center of Tryon street.

District No. 2.—All that part of the city of Charlotte lying north of the center of East Trade street, East Avenue, and Elizabeth Avenue, and east of the center of Tryon street.

District No. 3.—All that part of the city of Charlotte lying south of the center of East Trade street, East Avenue and Elizabeth Avenue, and east of the center of Tryon street.

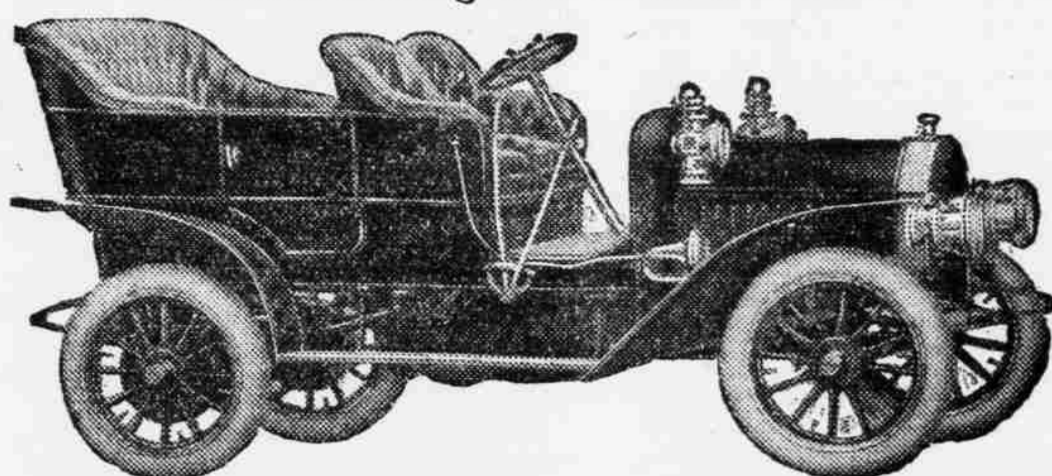

After the awarding of the second grand prize the candidate having the next greatest number of votes will be awarded the third grand prize, an elegant \$400 Foster Piano.

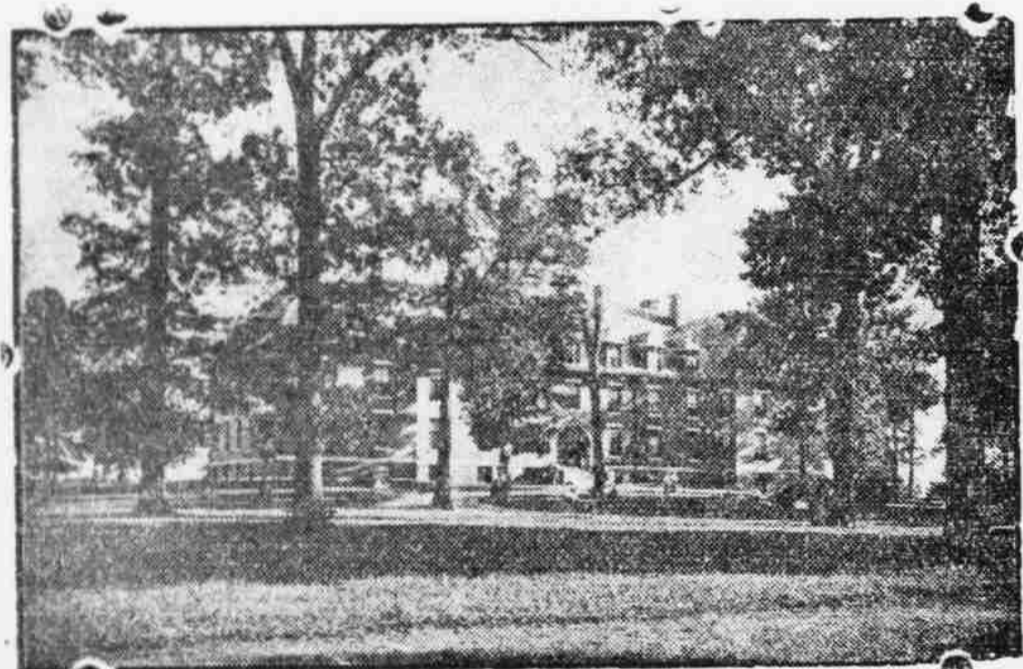
DISTRICT PRIZES NO. 1.

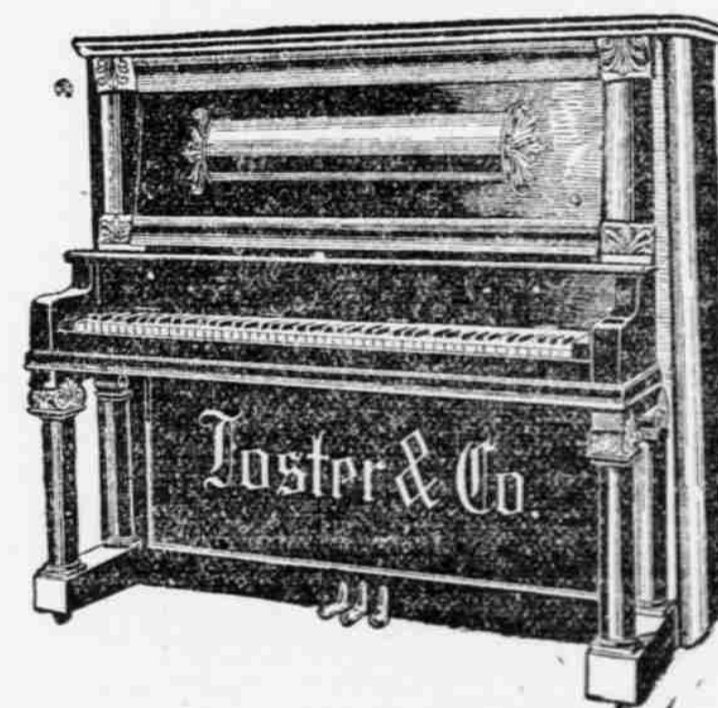

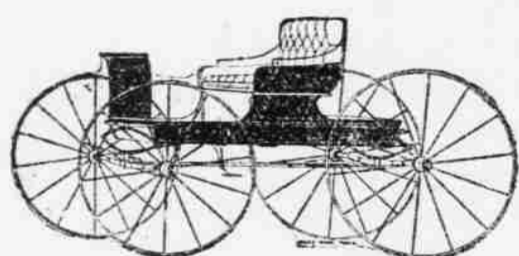

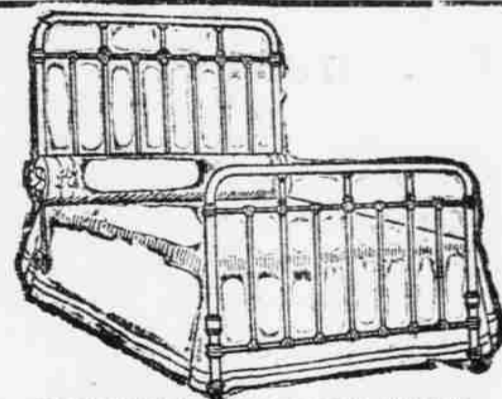
