Arrests By Summons Instead of Warrant

Chicago, Jan. 7.—The municipal court judges of Chicago have demanded that in the future all arrests for minor violations of a city ordinance shall be made by summons instead of by warrant.

When this police reform is inaugurated, as it will be as soon as the necessary blanks and books are printed, the humiliation of being arrested for some trivial offense will be removed.
