Prisoners Try To Saw Out Of The Mecklenburg Jail

An attempt by prisoners to escape from the Mecklenburg county jail was frustrated yesterday afternoon when Chief of Police Christenbury received information of the proposed delivery, and acting upon the information surprised the ones who are alleged to have conceived the plan to escape. A hacksaw and five new blades, a bottle of nitric acid and other things generally used by prisoners in sawing their way to freedom, were found in a cell of the prison. Two bars of one cell in the inner cage had been well-nigh sawed in two, and the men would have likely escaped last night had the information to Chief Christenbury been delayed.

T. H. Sibley and J. C. Masters, federal prisoners, are alleged to be the ones who contemplated the escape and who sawed the bars in their attempt. "Cricket" Wood, a white prisoner, communicated the information to the police department, the bars having been sawed in the cell used by him but to which all prisoners had access. According to Wood, he and another young man were to get \$25 each for maintaining silence and a prisoner named L. M. Hunter was to receive \$50 for the assistance he would render. Sibley and Masters are accused of using the United States mails for fraudulent purposes and have been unable to furnish bail. They were arrested in Jackson, Miss., and will be tried at the next term of federal court for the western district of North Carolina.

Both emphatically deny they are guilty of having tried to escape. Seen at the jail this morning by a reporter for The News the men said they knew nothing of the presence in the jail of the saws or the nitric acid and that no bars were sawed in their cell. "We were handcuffed together and taken outside while the jail was searched," said Masters, "and I do not know anything about any attempt at jail delivery. I wish they would return me the money that they took from me, that is all. Sibley corroborated Masters, and Hunter, who was near, said that he had not been offered any money to assist in the escape and that he knew nothing of the attempt.

The prisoner, Wood, had been under the care of a physician for some time and he told that doctor to tell the police of the plans of the prisoners to make their escape. When Chief Christenbury heard the news he went in company with Patrolmen Gardner and Pitts and made the startling discovery. Jailor Porter was not in the city at the time, being out in the county on official business. He was surprised when he returned and found that an attempt had been made to escape from the jail, and was greatly pleased that it had been frustrated just in time.

It is supposed that the saws were brought into the jail by a young woman who posed as the cousin of Masters and who visited him daily last week. She passed one package to him, saying that it contained clothes. She never gave her name to the attendants at the jail. A trusty was kept in the corridor and he finished his term this week. It is thought that the prisoners who contemplated the escape suspected this man and did not work until he went away. Officers Johnson and Earnhardt accompanied Chief Christenbury to the jail later in the evening and made a more thorough inspection.

The crime of which Masters and Sibley are alleged to be guilty is one that has interested many people through the state. They were promoters of the Albemarle Development Co., a something that has never been chartered but stock in which has been sold all through the United States. Several people in Charlotte own handsome residential sites in the beautiful place! Sibley lives in Albemarle but Masters has a home anywhere he hangs his hat.

A close watch will be kept on the men hereafter and their visitors will have to be searched before being admitted to the inner circle of the jail.

Deweyville, Tex., Feb. 1.—Two children of John Smith, a farmer, were drowned when a dug out canoe in which Smith, his wife and their three children were endeavoring to cross the Sabine river near Deweyville capsized yesterday. Smith rescued his wife and swam with her to the shore. One of the children, an infant, floated on the water until Smith reached it. Before he could make a third trip to the disabled craft, however, the two other children were drowned.

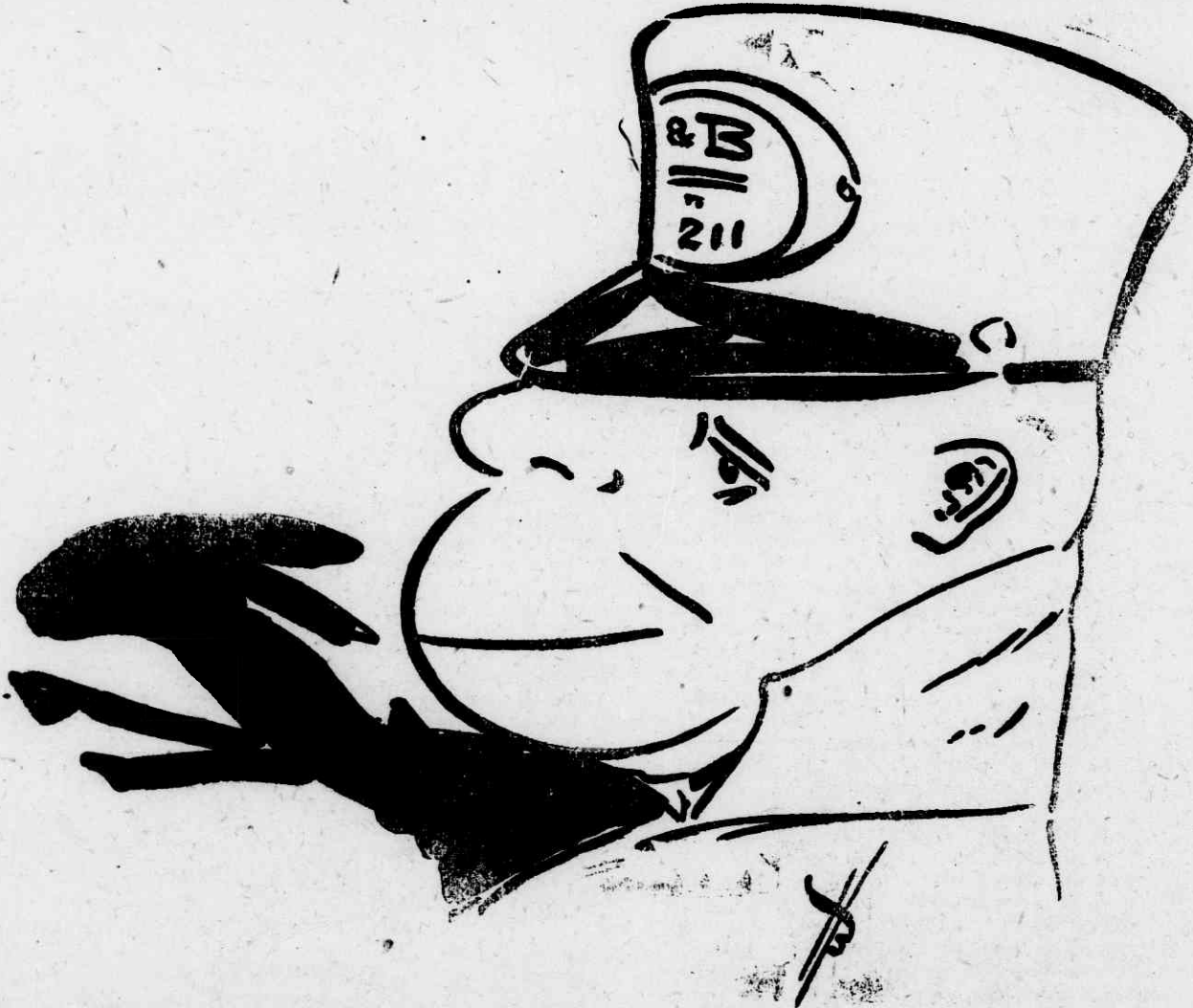
