Criminal Court Now In Session

First Appearance of Solicitor Wilson in Mecklenburg's Court Room—Fine Bearing in Court Room—Grand Jury.

The February term of Mecklenburg criminal court convened this morning at 10 o'clock, Judge M. H. Justice of Rutherfordton, presiding.

It was the first appearance of Solicitor Wilson before a Mecklenburg court and a rather larger attendance than usual assembled to witness the opening of court and to see the manner of man who is to succeed Mr. Heriot Clarkson in the role of public prosecutor.

Mr. Wilson went about his duties in a business-like way. His manner is impressive, his personality forceful and his bearing in the court room such as becomes him as solicitor, lawyer and gentleman.

Judge Justice's charge to the grand jury was an able one. He defined the duty of a grand jury in lucid and forceful terms, and stated that there was no need to go into a detailed definition of a Mecklenburg jury, as to the duties of a grand jury.

"Enlightenment, resulting from better educational facilities than formerly existed, has made that unnecessary," he said, "and you, as grand jurors, are to take cognizance of crime and misdemeanors with a view to conserving every energy and fostering every means toward guaranteeing a continuance of education, enlightenment and liberty."

The organization of court was completed this morning and one or two petty cases called and disposed of.

Will Probe Vote Selling

Danville, Ill., Feb. 13.—Hardy H. Whitlock, who was indicted last week accused of embezzling county funds, returned to Danville yesterday in custody of Sheriff Shepard and immediately proceeded to the court to be asked to what extent he had bought votes. He declined to answer.

Sheriff Shepard and his deputies began serving bench warrants this morning on some of the persons who were indicted last week.

The grand jury will assemble at 1:30 o'clock when it is expected vote selling at the Soldiers' Home will be delved into. Several persons connected with the management of the home have been subpoenaed.

Mr. Whitlock suddenly changed his mind this morning about remaining in Danville and left for Detroit. It was stated by his attorney that Mrs. Whitlock was ill at Detroit, which necessitated the presence of her husband.

The statement is being freely made on the streets and about the court house that Whitlock was urged to return to Detroit before a subpoena for the grand jury could be issued for him.

W. R. Mullineaux, also white, was assessed a V and permitted to contribute to the contingent fund in the way of costs.

Clayton Stegall broke into trouble by pouring spirits frumment into his hide and he is the loser by \$5 and costs.

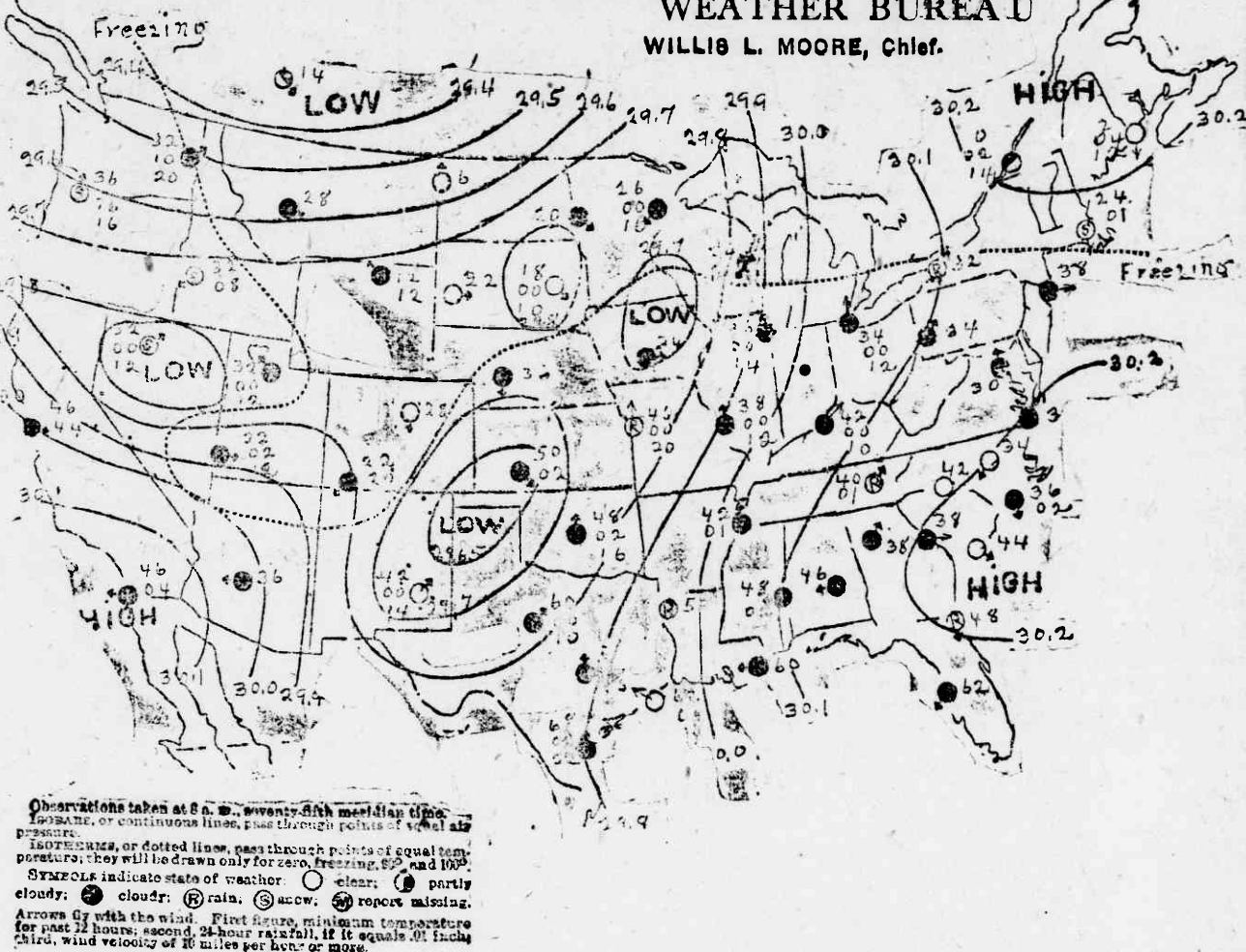

THE WEATHER. NI-NEWS OF SPORTS

Forecast for Charlotte and Vicinity. Warmer, with probably rain late tonight or Tuesday.

For North Carolina. Increasing cloudiness followed by rain late tonight or Tuesday, rising temperature.

Weather Conditions. Unstable barometric conditions prevail throughout the country this morning, and as a result there is much cloudy and unsettled weather, with dense fog at numerous places in the Middle and South Atlantic and east Gulf states.

Pressure is below normal west of the Mississippi except in the extreme Southwest, where a small high area exists. Storm centers are located in the Plains states and the extreme British Northwest with general precipitation west of the Rocky mountains.

Temperatures are higher in nearly all sections of the country, the rises being marked in the Plains states and the Southwest. It is unusually warm in most sections, especially in the southern and central portions of the United States. The temperature was nowhere as low as zero this morning.

The advance of the storm areas will result in increasing cloudiness, with rain in this section by Tuesday morning, and the weather will grow warmer.
