Bullish spot advices from the South helped the market and shortly after the opening old crop positions showed gains of from 10 to 11 points, with May selling at 14.33, or 68 points above the recent low level. At this price there was considerable realizing and local traders showed some disposition to take the short side on the reactionary theory, as a result of which reactions occurred from the best, but spot people were buyers on the dips and the market during the middle of the morning was within 2 or 3 points of the best with the tone steady.
