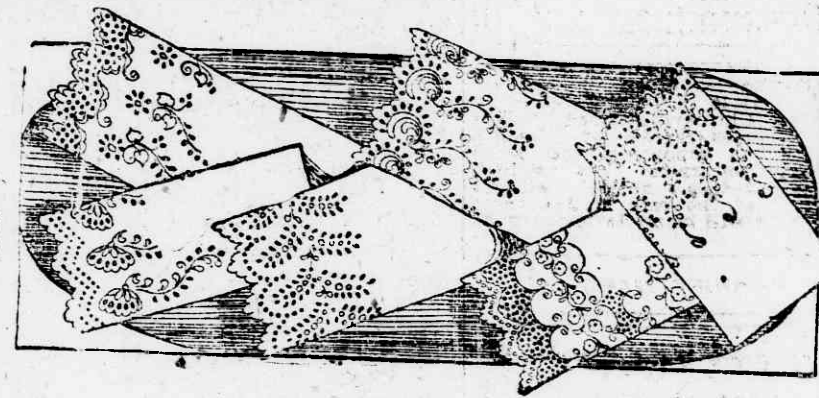
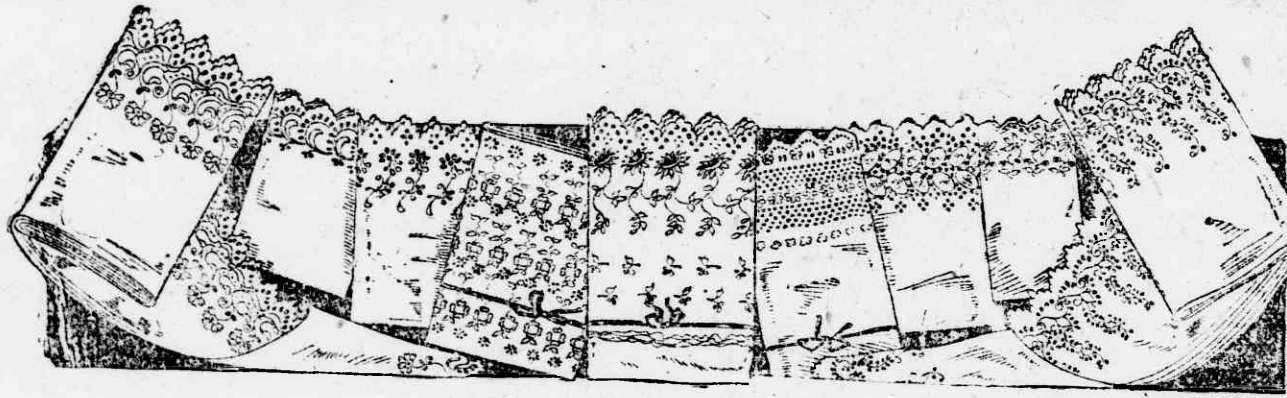
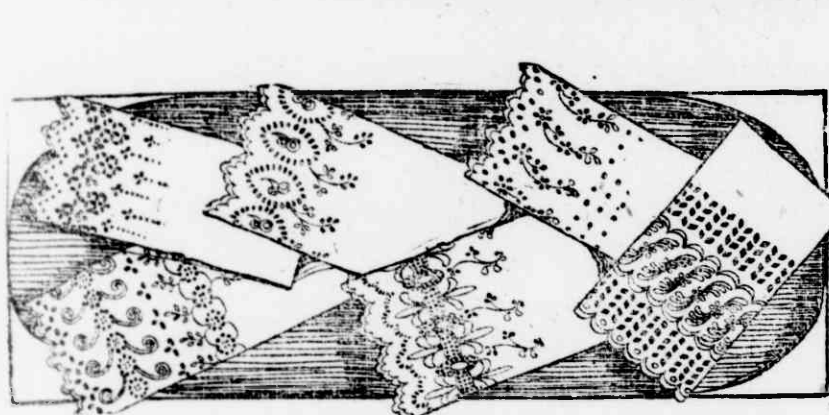

NEW LOCAL CAMP Farmers' Union

The Amity local is the latest branch of the North Carolina Farmers' Union to be organized in Mecklenburg county. The new local organization was completed Friday at the home of Mr. P. C. Harkey, Jr., on the Monroe road in Crab Orchard township, with 35 members. The officers of the new organization are Messrs. John Walker, president; P. C. Harkey, Jr., vice-president; C. B. Miller, secretary-treasurer; Mr. D. A. Jenkins, chaplain; Walter D. Harkey, door keeper; Lester Phillips, conductor.

The new local union will be composed of some of the best farmers in the county and starts out with excellent prospect. The charter membership of 35 is perhaps larger than that shown by any other local union in the county.

Petition For Bridge At Sloan's Ferry
A petition was circulated yesterday among the people of the city and county, asking the commissioners of Mecklenburg county to co-operate with the commissioners of Gaston county in erecting a bridge at Sloan's ferry.

The petition was signed rapidly, and it is believed that the county commissioners here will take up the matter at once with the Gaston commissioners.

It will be remembered that a bill was represented to the legislature recently authorizing the two counties to erect the bridge jointly.

A special act had to be secured, allowing such co-operation, and now that it has been granted by the legislature, the people show a determination to push the matter to completion.
