The Papal Army Being Reformed

Rome, March 11. - While reforms are taking place in all European armies, especial mention of what is taking place now in the small army of the Pope may be interesting.

The recent Pope, from the beginning of his pontificate, showed a marked disposition to cut down all expenses that he considered superfluous, aiming especially at those which had as their object the pomp and ceremony of state. He began by suppressing the horses which were kept in the Vatican stables for the Noble Guard in view of the improbability that the Holy Father might one day desire to leave his voluntary prison for a drive through the Eternal City, in which case he would have to be escorted by this body-guard who was originally formed by the amalgamation of Papal Veterans with a still older cavalry regiment.

The Palatine Guard, a regiment of militia formed by volunteers of the Roman class, are now scarcely seen, as the occasions on which they should be present, such as great functions in St. Peter's, are so rare. The gendarme entrusted with the policing of the vatican are, strange to say, taken entirely from those who have served as carabinieri in the army of Italy, the two bodies being identical in organization and also in uniform, the only substantial difference being that the papal gendarmes have grey trousers and blue bands and the Italian carabinieri black trousers and red bands. Plus X. augmented and strengthened the papal firemen after the fire which, shortly after his ascension to the throne, threatened to destroy the vatican library.

Now it is the turn of reform in the Swiss guard, the institution of which dates from the fifteenth century; under Sixtus IV, who chose a regiment of Helvetians for their unshaken loyalty. Last year the commander of the Swiss guard, Baron Meyer de Schauensee, died, and in his place Col. Repond, of Friburg, was appointed, who, as soon as he arrived in Rome, having taken orders from the pontiff, undertook a thorough inquiry into the organization of the body put under his command. The first result of this has been the resignation of Lieutenant colonel. At the same time Col. Repond is carrying on strict reforms in order to restore the nucleus of the ancient regiment to its military traditions, insisting above all that the soldiers should really be recruited according to the rules of the Swiss army in Switzerland, while for years it has been a common saying that a good many of the Swiss of the pope came from the Albanian hills.

The new commander has restored military exercise, including rifle practice, which had practically fallen into disuse. In the matter of uniforms the Swiss Guard has had only one, the gala uniform, which is so well known to all visitors to the vatican. This it owed to Michelangelo, who has thus preserved to posterity the Swiss national costume of his day. Therefore the present Swiss Guard, since this gorgeous uniform would be unsuitable for doing active exercises, has been in the habit of drilling in militia. The new commander is now considering the adoption of a dress uniform which, while harmonizing with the picturesque and part-colored garments to which guards are accustomed, shall be adapted to modern requirements.

A New World's Bowling Record

Buffalo, N. Y., March 11. - A new world's bowling record was being set in the national bowling association tournament this afternoon by Kelsey and Johnson, of New Haven, Conn., who registered a score of 1,355 in the two-man series. The best previous score was 1,318, by McQuirk and Grady, of Paterson, N. J.

Kelsey's scores were 225, 233, 242, and Johnson's 202, 234, and 219. Kelsey made 21 strikes, 10 spares, two splits and no errors, constituting a perfect game. Johnson had 18 strikes, nine spares, two splits and one error.

YANKEE COLTS WALLOW GEORGIA TEAM. Athens, Ga., March 11. - The Yankee Colts walloped the University of Georgia team in a farcical contest this afternoon by a score of 14 to 3. Ables, the big Texas southpaw, pitched the first five innings and during that time only one collegian reached first. Revelle went the rest of the distance and in working the soreness out of his arm handed the opposition a trio of tallies. Litschi was the Yankee star with four hits in four times up, one of them a home run.

The Yankee regulars will arrive from Hot Springs, Va., Monday morning. Frank McCreed, the Yankee's star outfielder, returned today.
