Sacramento, Cal., March 18 .- The judiciary committee of the senate recommended the passage of a bill designed to prevent Asiatics from acquiring land in California. The committee took four bills of this character proposed by members and grouped

them into one. The measure recommended provides that no alien who is not eligible to citizenship and no corporation in which such aliens own a majority of the stock shall hereafter acquire land in the state.


