## Big Fight Over Labeling of Drugs

Washington, April 13.-The lirst big legal contest arising out of the passage of the pure food and drug act of 1906 had the right of way today in the supreme court of the United States. The government was making a last effort to sustain its claim to the right to prosecute criminally persons who labelled drugs or medicines with false statements about the curative properties of their preparations.

The point arose in the district court of western Missouri, where an indictment against Dr. O. A.
