Mr. Roosevelt says in part:

"The men responsible for dynamit ing the Los Angeles Times building are responsible not only for the wreck of the newspaper offices, but for the loss of many lives.

"The arrest was made in quence of testimony secured by Mr Burns, who has been Mr. Heney's right hand man in bringing to justice grafters who violated the law of the United States in Oregon and grafters who vioential politicians and the richest business men. It happens that the men whom he has now arrested are mem bers of a labor organization; just as men whom he formerly arrested were members of the republican or demo cratic parties or of great and wealthy
