New Street Needed. Dr. J. A. Austin appeared before the board in behalf of the proposed new street to connect Elizabeth avenue and East Seventh street. He stated that owing to the heavy travel along East Seventh street the dust clouds made the section unfit for residential purposes and stated further that a street connecting the two streets mentioned Mr. F. C. Abbott had offered to donate to the city a lot 200x50 feet as soon as the connecting street was opened and that the jonger the matter was delay ed the greater the cost would be, since the neighborhood would soon be so Feet Tired-thickly settled that a large amount of property would have to be condemned, if it were decided later to open a street there. City Engineer Firth said he had

made an estimate of the cost of opening the street and found that it could be done for about \$1,700.

City Engineer's Salary Raised. Upon motion made by Mr. Murphy the saiary of Mr. Firth, city engineer and superintendent of streets, was raised from \$2,000 a year to \$2,400. The salary of Mr. Lloyd Ross, assistant engineer, was raised \$20 per menth. Mr. Firth is at present occupying the position of street superintendent as well as his regular position of city engineer, and it was deemed only a matter of justice that his salary be mereased.

The request of Chief of Police T. M Christenbury, that 20 helmets and six pair of handcuffs be provided for the police department, was granted unanihously.

The resignation of two members of the fire department were accepted by the board. They were Messrs. E. G. Graham and Leo Fleming.
