Want Duty on Sugar Reduced

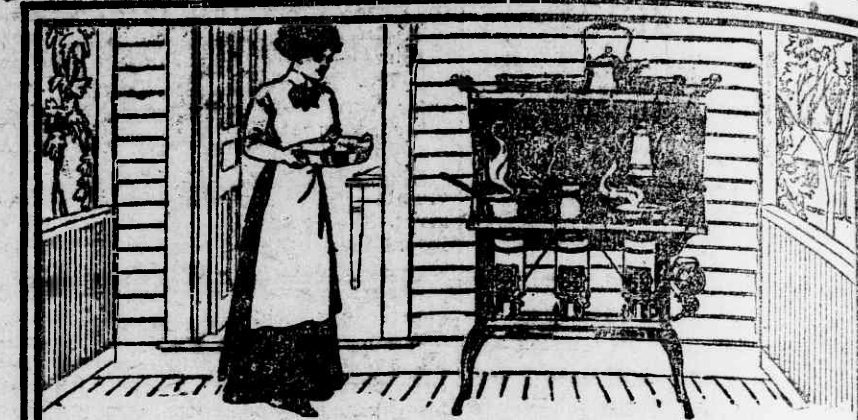

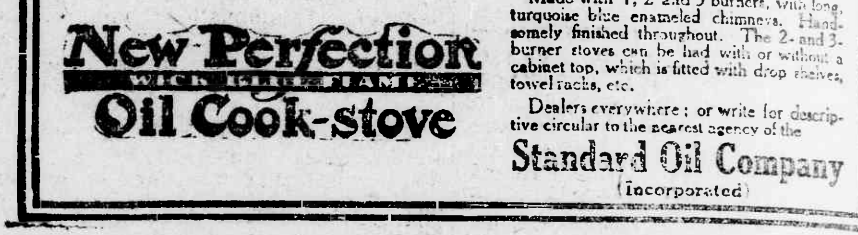
