

North Bound Train Held Up Near West Fork and Mail Car-Rifled—Safe Blown and Registered Mail Taken and Yeggs Leave.

Express Messenger Refused to Allow Them to Enter His Car-Train was Thought to Have Been Carrying Large Amount of Gold Dust.

Glendale, Ore., June 29 .- Apparenty mistaking the first section of northbound passenger train No. 16 on the Southern Pacific railroad for a southbound train said to be carrying a shipment of \$400,000 in gold dust from Sethe closing of the Pennsylvania Sugar attle to San Francisco, two robbers Refining Company, told the committee held up the northbound train last night near West Fork, an isolated station in Cow Creek sanyon.

The robbers rifled the mail car, blowing up the safe, and made away with the registered mail. They tried to secure entrance to the express car but were foiled by Messenger Robb, who refused to open the door despite threats that they would use dynamite if he resisted. The robbers after fruitlessly prying with a crow bar at the side door of the car, finally desisted and decamped with the loot secured from the mail car.

The amount taken by the robbers cannot be ascertained at this time. This train carries in its registered mail the cash from Southern Oregon post offices to Eugene, Ore., which is their depository, and this was probably

included in the mail stolen. The robbers boarded the train at West Fork while the engine was taking way they crawled over the tender into the cab and directed the engineer to
