New York, July 17 .- The new treaty of commerce and navigation between the United States and Japan went into operation today, replacing the old treaty negotiated during Secretary Gresham's administration. The important point of difference between the two conventions lies in the omission from the new convention of the paragraph in the old relating to immigration restrictions which was objectionable to the Japanese, the United States relying upon the honor of Japan to carry out the spirit of existing undertakings which prevent the departure of Japanese coolies to America.
