

Weekly Meeting Executive Board

Blythe & Isehour Given Contract For Remodeling of City Hall—Dogs Without Collars Will be Taken to The Pound Until Redeemed.

The executive board met in weekly session last night. The most important business transacted was the awarding of the contract to the firm of Blythe & Isehour, of this city for extensive improvements that have been planned in the city hall, about \$1,000, having been appropriated by the board of aldermen for that purpose.

The improvements planned are for new and more sanitary cells in the city prison, with separate apartments for men and women, and the transformation of the council chamber on the second floor of the city hall into a police court room.

An elevator will also be installed to facilitate connection between the police department and the court room above. Work will likely begin in an early date, since the appropriation has been made.

The Dog Question. The board gave considerable discussion to the question of getting rid of the city's dog population which is not properly tagged and accounted for.

proper place. The board, after considerable discussion of the matter and an examination of the ordinances, decided to establish a pound at the crematory and detain the dogs there for two days, according to the provisions of the ordinance.

The pound will be an inclosure of wire netting with a shed to protect the animals from the sun and with proper facilities for feeding and watering them.

A \$2.50 impoundment fee will be imposed for those dogs which are redeemed and this will materially reduce the expense.

A horse at the fire department which is not being used at present, will be hitched to a wagon picked up from some other department of the city and constitute the dog catchers' outfit, more properly speaking, it will constitute the canine "Black Maria."

As to the actual process of catching, no provision was made by the board, and the police, with the assistance of Mr. W. A. Neal, who has general charge of the dog ridding campaign, will have to devise means of corralling the stray canines. The action of the board in dealing with the dog problem was hastened by the information given by Desk Sergeant J. M. Scullion acting as chief of police in the absence of Chief Christenbury.
