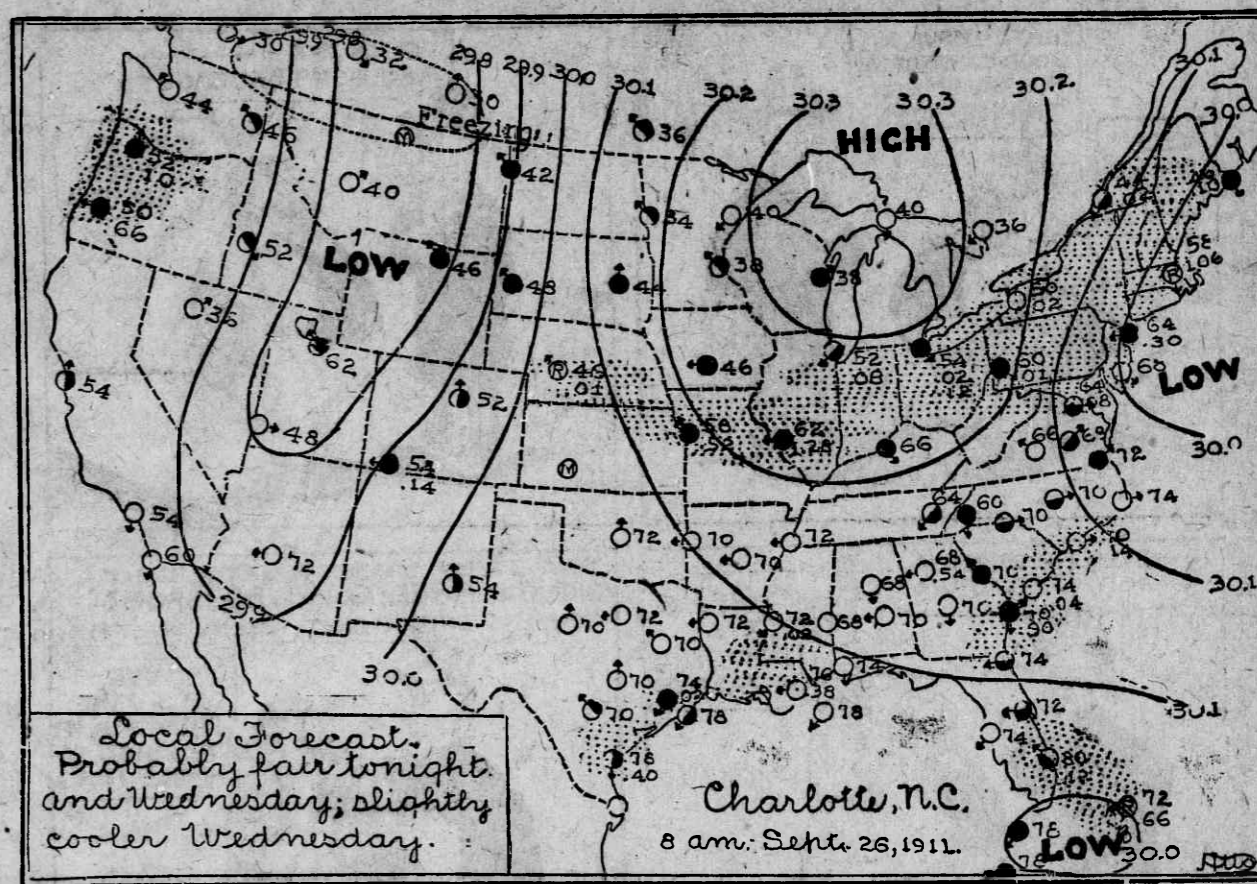


Late Market Reports Complete Cotton-Stocks-Grain-Provisions-Miscellaneous

Observations taken at 8 a. m. 76th meridian time. Isobars or continuous lines; pass through points of equal air pressure. Isotherms, or dotted lines, pass through points of equal temperature; they will be drawn only for zero, freezing, 90 degrees and 100 degrees. Symbols indicate state of weather: O clear; C partly cloudy; ☁ cloudy; ☉ rain; ❄ snow; ⚡ report missing. Arrows fly with the wind. First figure, minimum temperature for past 12 hours; second, 24-hour rainfall, if it equals .01 inch; third, wind velocity of 10 miles per hour or more.

New York Cotton

New York, Sept. 26.—The cotton market opened steady at a decline of 3 points on October, which made a new low record under overnight selling orders but from 1 to 6 points higher on later months, which soon sold from 9 to 10 points above yesterday's closing figures while October rallied to a net advance of 3 points on active covering and trade buying. Covering was probably prompted by less favorable crop advices from Mississippi and Louisiana and reports that spinners were calling cotton more freely on the decline but the South was a big seller here on the early advance and prices early in the morning eased off four or five points from the best.

New York Stock Market

New York, Sept. 26.—Stocks developed pronounced weakness again at the opening today with especially large selling of United States Steel, Union Pacific and the Copper shares. United States Steel opened with a block of 12,000 shares at from 55 5/8 to 54 5/8, an extreme loss of 1 1/4 from yesterday's close. Within a few minutes it fell to 54. The preferred stock also declined 1/4 to 104 1/4.

Chicago Grain

Chicago, Sept. 26.—A liberal increase in the European visible supply had a tendency today to make the wheat market easy. The opening was 1-3 to 3-8 lower. December started at 98 1/4 to 98 1/2, the same change from last night as the market taken altogether. Later the price held steady around 98 3/8.

New Orleans Cotton

New Orleans, Sept. 26.—Cotton futures opened steady at an advance of 2 to 3 points. Cables were none too good but shorts were heavy buyers to realize profits. After the call they using increased and although leading bears offered a great deal of cotton the inquiry was sufficient to absorb everything for sale and to keep the market advancing. Lighter receipts at Texas points and the fear that labor troubles would interfere with the movement of cotton to this market helped to put prices up. At the end of the first hour of business the trading months were 6 to 7 points over yesterday's close.
