Manse Broken Into Last Night

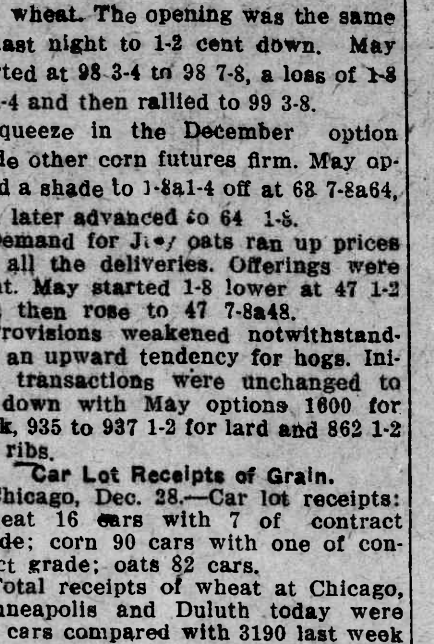
After the Christmas tree and exercises last night at the First A. K. P. church, some one broke into the back door leading into the kitchen of the manse.
