

NORFOLK SOUTHERN ENGINEERS HAVE REACHED CONCORD

Concord, Feb. 10.—Messrs. F. L. Nicholson, chief engineer, J. M. Clark and D. W. Lum of the surveying corps of the Norfolk Southern railroad, who were here yesterday, came here from Albemarle by Mount Pleasant, where the surveying corps are surveying a route.

These gentlemen spent the day in and around Concord making estimates and surveys leading into town. The citizens of Concord agreed to give the road a right of way and proper depot facilities for the line would come by here. They have not yet decided on where the road will enter the town and it will probably be several weeks before this is done.

There are three corps of surveyors in the field. One between Troy and the Yadkin river, one between the river and Albemarle and one between Albemarle and Mount Pleasant. The corps between Troy and the river are camping in the Uwharrie mountains. This will likely remain there for about three months as this is the critical section of the route. The distance from Troy to the river leads through the center of the Uwharrie mountains and it would be necessary, if this route is adopted, to run the line through the heart of them. As the situation now is this route is the one most likely to be adopted. It has been familiar with the section of country beyond the river that the route leading from Mount Gilead to Albemarle by reason of the fact that the natural conditions are much more favorable toward building the line at less cost. In the section along this line there are no hills of much consequence and it is claimed that the line could run what is known as the river ridge and this would not necessitate near so much grading as the line from Troy through the hills. It is not likely, however, that this route will be adopted, as it would make the road seven or eight miles longer and one of the engineers stated this morning that it was the shortest possible distance without regard to expense that the officials of the road were working for. He gave this reason as his opinion that the line would go out from the Aberdeen & Ashboro, at Troy.

Boston, Mass., Feb. 10.—None of the 22 annual sets of track and field games conducted by the Boston Athletic Association which annually have been regarded as practically deciding the indoor collegiate championships, besides offering the best of club competition, has contained an entry list to compare with that for the 23rd revival of the game to be held in Mechanics building tonight. Champions, intercollegiate or national, of almost every event on the track and field program, are included in the 463 entries.

Besides 11 standard track and field events there will be the usual score of relay races between leading colleges and athletic clubs.

House Votes

Cavalry Reduction

Washington, D. C., Feb. 10.—A reduction of the cavalry force of the army from 15 to 10 regiments, with a consequent reduction of the enlisted force of the army by 3,930 men, was voted in the army appropriation bill in the house yesterday after a bitter fight.

The cavalry reduction amendment was presented by Chairman Hay, of the military affairs committee, who was in charge of the \$88,000,000 appropriation bill but it did not bear the endorsement of the committee. It was vigorously opposed by the republicans of the house and it will probably be the cause of another fight when the bill is put upon its final passage.

Mr. Hay declared the United States army was topheavy with cavalry. Where the British army had a cavalry force equal to one-sixth of the infantry, he said, the American cavalry was equal to one-half the infantry strength. The Hay amendment as adopted today would establish a maximum of 10 regiments of cavalry. The enlisted men in the five regiments thus to be dropped would be mustered out, but the officers would be retained and absorbed into other regiments of cavalry, or into other branches of the army, without reduction of grade. It was estimated by Chairman Hay that the immediate saving from the reduction in cavalry force would be \$4,256,253.

The present strength of the army is 30 regiments of infantry and 15 regiments of cavalry. The Hay amendment, if retained in the final draft of the army appropriation bill would become effective July 1st, 1912.

EXPERIMENTS IN SPACE PERCEPTION

Atlanta, Ga., Feb. 10.—A recent number of a German magazine, entitled Ebbinghaus' Grundzuge, contains an extended review of some of the psychological experiments of President H. J. Pearce, which were conducted in the psychological laboratory of that distinguished Southern scientist at Brenau.

Dr. Pearce was the first investigator to demonstrate illusions of touch which are exactly analogous to certain optical illusions of touch which are exactly analogous to certain optical illusions, and in the article in question, Ebbinghaus points out the very great importance of these investigations in their bearing upon the whole theory of illusion in general.

Dr. Pearce is now engaged in the preparation of a new series of experiments which have an important bearing upon the general theory of space perception. These experiments will be conducted further in the college, with the assistance of the students and the results will be reported to the American Psychological Journal.
